Our music department is putting the final touches on the upcoming holiday programs which will be held in person this year. Please look to our website ridgedaleschools.org for the most up to date holiday program information. As a reminder our district will be out of school from December 22 – December 31, 2021 with school resuming on Monday January 3, 2022.

The Board of Education recently adopted the new Covid-19 guidelines from the Ohio Department of Health, "Mask to Stay and Test to Play". With this change in quarantine guidelines we are better able to keep our children in school and in front of their teachers. Since we have been back in person this school year, we have seen an increase in academic achievement for a majority of our students. However, there are still pockets of learning loss that we will continue to address. The "Mask to Stay and Test to Play" guidelines can be found at the district website.

The Board of Education, administration, faculty, staff and students would like to THANK the entire Ridgedale Community for your support in passing the renewal of an emergency operating levy in the amount 3.72 mils, which is down from the original millage of 11.9 mils passed in 1992. As you know this Emergency Operating Levy is not an increase to your tax bill is still subjected to the rollback and homestead exemptions that were eliminated by the Ohio Legislature in 2014. This levy will collect \$575,034/ year for a period of five (5) years. This levy is very important for the continued day to day operations of the district, allowing us to continue to fund programs that were started with grant money, and will soon be expiring. We are very fortunate that we are able to bring in the latest technology and educational opportunities for our students.

As we wind down 2021 I am very excited for the hustle and bustle of the Holiday Season and with it the hope that 2022 is less hectic that the previous two years. As a reminder the quarantine and masking plans in place are as of right now, and hopefully they will not change for the remainder of this school year. We will continue to follow all protocols as set by Marion Public Health and CDC guidelines for disinfecting and cleaning. 





As we work with our striving readers it is important to use as many multi-sensory strategies as possible. This means we try to engage as many of our students' senses when doing an activity. First and second graders have been very busy working on phonics patterns, learning to read, write, and make words using those patterns. 




