Welcome Back Jr./Sr. High School Students, Faculty, and Staff!

It's going to be a great school year, and I am very much looking forward to making acquaintances with all of our Ridgedale students, their families, the Rocket faculty and staff, and the community members of our district. It has been a smooth transition to my new position as your Jr./Sr. High School Principal, and it's my hope to continue with our improvement initiatives in striving to make Ridgedale the choice for education in our surrounding area.

We are welcoming some new staff members to the junior high and high school this year, and we are excited that they will become part of our Ridgedale family:

Brandon Friend - Junior High Science, Robotics, and Inventionland - Mr. Friend is coming to us from St. Mary's School in Marion where he also taught junior high science, social studies and health.

Nina Greer - Junior High English - Miss Greer is a 2022 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University with a degree in English/Language Arts. She did her student teaching at Olentangy Berlin High School.

Jarrid McGuire - Junior High Math, English, and Social Studies - Mr. McGuire came to us from Grant Middle School in Marion where he taught both science and social studies.

Spanish - Our Spanish (and French) instruction will be hosted through an educational service operating out of Pennsylvania called World of Learning. This institute will provide our foreign language students with direct, face-to-face instruction via the Internet two times per week through Ohio-licensed instructors. These same instructors will also provide work for our students to be completed on the days where direct instruction doesn't take place. Our foreign language students will still be provided the opportunity to listen, write, and speak a foreign language, just as if they had a five-day-per-week, live teacher; now, it will happen via the Internet. I used this service last year when we couldn't locate a Spanish teacher, and World of Learning worked out very well for our students with a very good success rate.

Finally, I'm Mr. Vogt, and, as mentioned, I'm your new Jr./Sr. High School Principal. This will be my sixteenth year in administration having served previously as an athletic director, dean of students, assistant principal, middle school and high school principal. I have also taught for seventeen years as an English instructor (with a side trip in special education and health), and I've coached basketball since I've been in college back in 1988 but retired from it this past year. Originally from northwest Indiana, I've been in Ohio since 1996. My wife Chris and I have been married for 31 short years this past June, and we reside southwest of Bellevue, Ohio. We have two kids of whom we are very proud. Our daughter Kaelan is a musical theatre major living her dream in Hoboken, New Jersey, just across the river from Manhattan always auditioning and working in a local bistro to make ends meet. 

Elementary students will be dismissed from the old computer lab doors behind the building, while JH/HS students will be dismissed from the lower level gym doors. If you have a student in each, please pick up at elementary first and then proceed to the JH/HS pick up location. Please form two lines behind the elementary school to help aid in dismissal.

Elementary families will be able to pick up their dismissal car numbers at Open House on August 22nd from their homeroom teacher.

We ask that you wait for the vehicle/s in front of you to move before proceeding down the hill and to the exit, and to please proceed with caution to ensure for the safety of your vehicle and those around you.
