

This will be very similar to the 2nd chance breakfast that is occurring at CCHS. 2nd chance breakfast is an opportunity for students to get breakfast that were late to school, didn't have time before school to eat breakfast, or just need another little boost to get them to lunch. The price for 2nd chance breakfast is the same as normal breakfast. Also, if a student that is on free or reduced priced meals eats both breakfasts, they will be charged full price for the second breakfast. Lastly, at CCHS students will have opportunities for a' la carte in addition to their regular meal. After they get a school meal they will then have the opportunity to purchase other items such as cookies, flavored water, etc.. These a' la carte items will be charged to their lunch account. Please be aware that your high school student's lunch account balance may go down quicker than previously. If you have any questions on this please contact the appropriate school.
