Information Items - Generally, these items are for discussion only; no action is requested at the meeting.

- A. Student Representative Hudson Parker presented an update from the student body. Highlights included the Science Olympiad team advancing to the State competition at the end of April and seven (7) DECA students will attend the International Conference later this month. The Be Nice group has started Mental Health Mondays on the announcements to give helpful tips and advice on how to reach out to someone who may be affected. Spring Sports are now in full swing, and multiple competitions are taking place, including our Boy's Volleyball Club, which will participate in a quad tournament at Lowell High School this week. GHS students have started testing this week as well. The Montcalm Youth Prevention Club is offering a "Safe Prom" opportunity this year to those interested. This free opportunity includes a meal, photos and transportation to and from the Grand Rapids Museum for the GHS Prom on Saturday, April 30.
- B. Superintendent Linda Van Houten invited Director of Student Services Allyson Bradley to review the GPS 2021-22 General Supervision State Special Education Determinations and Josh Kirshman to provide an update on the Marketing component of the GPS Strategic Plan 2.0.
- C. Assistant Superintendent Matt McCullough presented the current 2022-2023 GHS Course Offerings for lower and upper classmates. *This will be an action item during the regular May meeting.* Matt also reported meeting with the Board Curriculum Committee to discuss the request to implement a new GMS math curriculum Carnegie Math. *This will be an action item during the regular May meeting.* Finally, Matt also reported the district released its summer learning opportunities for GPS students on Friday. There are various options for students to continue their learning this summer, including credit recovery.
- D. Director of Human Resources Lisa Steed provided a full staffing update for the district and a retirement letter. Lisa also presented the tenure report as well as the yearly contract renewals for Social Workers and Speech Therapists. The contract renewals for Social Workers and Speech Therapists will be an action item for the regular May Board of Education.
- E. Linda Van Houten presented administrative contract renewals, which are two-year rolling contracts. *This will be an action item during the regular May Board of Education Meeting.*
- F. The MAISD General Fund Proposed Budget was presented for the first reading. The Board Finance Committee has thoroughly reviewed the proposed budget. *This will be an action item during the regular May Board of Education Meeting.*
- G. Board Vice President Kire Wierda provided an update for the Education Foundation of Greenville (EFG). The next EFG fundraiser is the Yellow Jacket Challenge on Sunday, April 24. During the next EFG meeting, summer scholarships will be awarded.
- H. Board President Norice Rasmussen provided an update from the Montcalm County School Boards Association (MCSBA). The spring meeting will be held on Monday, April 25 at MCC in the Doser Building.
- I. Jim Anderson provided a brief legislative update.
