Information Items - Generally, these items are for discussion only; no action is requested at the meeting.

- A. Student Representative Report Student Representative Sophie Gardner presented a brief update from the student body. Highlights throughout the District included several end-of-the-year activities. Baldwin Heights hosted a Field Day and a successful award ceremony recognizing various student achievements. Cedar Crest hosted a carnival and a school-wide picnic. Lincoln Heights also held a Field Day, complete with a dunk tank. Walnut Hills celebrated its final school-wide PBIS award by having a dance party at each recess, and there were over 20 acts in their school Talent Show. GMS wrapped up the year with award assemblies to honor many student achievements, and GHS celebrated the Class of 2023 during honors week and graduation! Summer break has officially begun, and the Winning Edge program is off to a great start! On June 15, there will be an athletic booster event at Frugthaven, with proceeds going to GPS athletics.
- B. Superintendent Report Superintendent Roedel recognized several district celebrations featured in

the *Inspiring Excellence* document (below). Superintendent Roedel also provided some information regarding the question raised during public comment about the status of live streaming of Board meetings. The technology pieces for the Community Room to be used as a training facility with streaming capabilities, including Board meetings if the Board decides to offer that option, have been ordered. The policy committee will meet this month to discuss what live streaming of Board meetings could entail if the Board decides to implement it.

- C. Assistant Superintendent Report Assistant Superintendent Matt McCullough provided a Benchmark Assessments Update/STAR Extended Covid-19 Goal Report; the growth we hoped to achieve occurred in most areas. Additional data will be available next month to see if we are reaching our goals. Summer School starts next week and will be held for five weeks (excluding the week of July 4th). We have approximately 120 students in K-5th grade and about 60 high school students participating in credit recovery.
- D. Non-Homestead Operating Millage Renewal Superintendent Roedel informed the Board our current Non-Homestead Operating Millage will expire in 2024. Superintendent Roedel and Finance Director Matt Andres met with the district's election attorney to discuss options for this to be placed on an upcoming ballot. The state formula for funding expects this millage to pass, but funding is not made up if the millage does not pass. If the Board would like to go forward with the Non-Homestead Operating Millage Renewal on the November 2023 ballot, this would need to be an action item during the regular July Board of Education Meeting to meet election deadlines.
- E. Superintendent Roedel presented the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) Membership Renewal Notice for 2023-2024. *This will be an action item for the regular July meeting.*
- F. Superintendent Roedel presented the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Membership Resolution for 2023-2024. *This will be an action item for the regular July meeting.*
- G. Board President Kire Wierda presented the Montcalm County School Boards Association (MCSBA) Membership Resolution; the Board will need to appoint a Board Member to be their representative and a Board Member to be the alternate during the 2023-2024 school year. *This will be an action item for the regular July meeting.*
- H. Greenville Public Schools' parent, Kim Betser, has again accepted the MAISD Parent Advisory Committee role for the 2023-2024 school year. *This will be an action item for the regular July meeting.*
- I. Legislative Update Board Treasurer Jim Anderson provided a brief legislative update.
- J. Assistant Superintendent of HR & Operations Report Superintendent Roedel deferred to Lisa Steed's provided documentation in the Board packet regarding a full staffing update for the District, including letters of resignation and/or retirement. Questions regarding the Band Director position were answered.

Invention Ideas


