3.1 Thank you to Cindy Cox for her Years of Service

Mr. Simpson expressed his thanks to Cindy for her years of service. Cindy joined the team at Home Street Middle School in 2003 as the Native American Liaison then transferred to Bishop Elementary in 2015 as the school Librarian. Shawn Bengocia thanked her for her contribution to the Native American community and Principal Patrick Twomey thanked her for her dedication and for always doing what was best for the students.

5.3.1 Dr. Gretchen Skrotzki/Garrett Carr, Bishop Elementary School Principal

Kath Zack suggested combining bilingual homework club with after school program so students will feel more comfortable and attendance/enrollment might improve.

Healthy Kids survey was low in numbers due to very few permission slips being turned in.

Steve Elia – next steps?...GS – working on long term goals and SMART goals. Offered his help in any way in regards to the AVID program.

TL – first round of parent conferences has taken place – are parents aware of AVID. Teachers are presenting the AVID folders but some need to work on making AVID common language.

TO – inquired about the “college question of the day”. GC explained that by grade level, students hear morning announcements and he'll include a “college question of the day”. The questions are grade level appropriate. Students are exposed to information regarding colleges that should be helpful in answering the questions. GC provided each teacher with a classroom name plate which also indicates which college they attended.

TO – is AVID “clicking” and is there buy in? GS – yes, AVID is not just another thing to do but something to add to the teachers tool box.

Parent Meryl Picard spoke up stating that she is very pleased with the AVID programs and that her children are more organized because of it, even the young ones.
