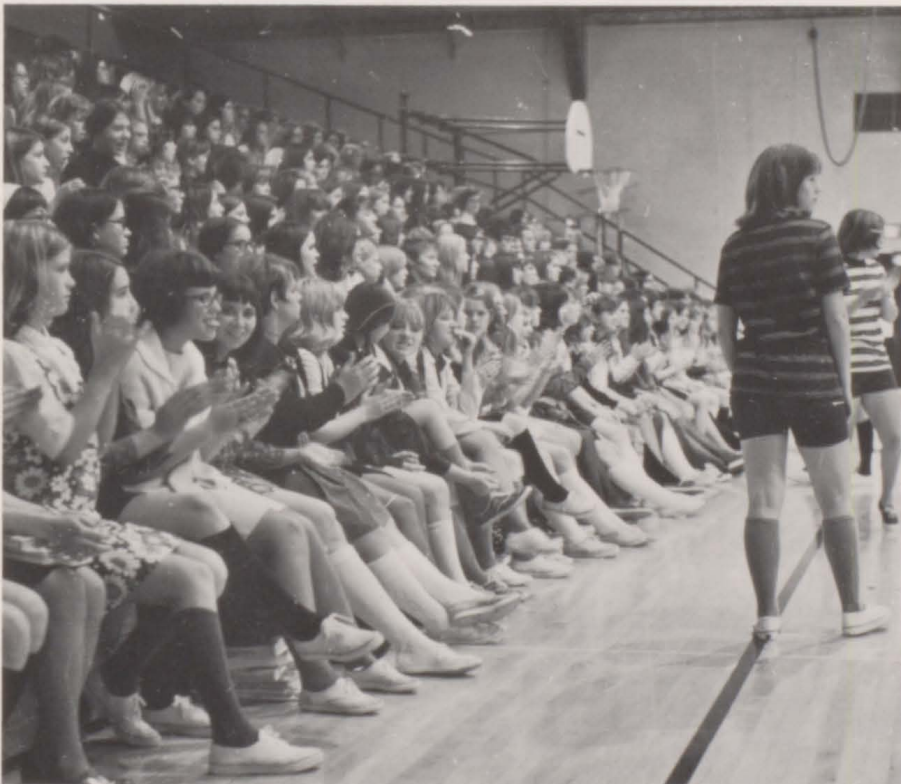

Skirts went from the high to the popular midi and maxi lengths.

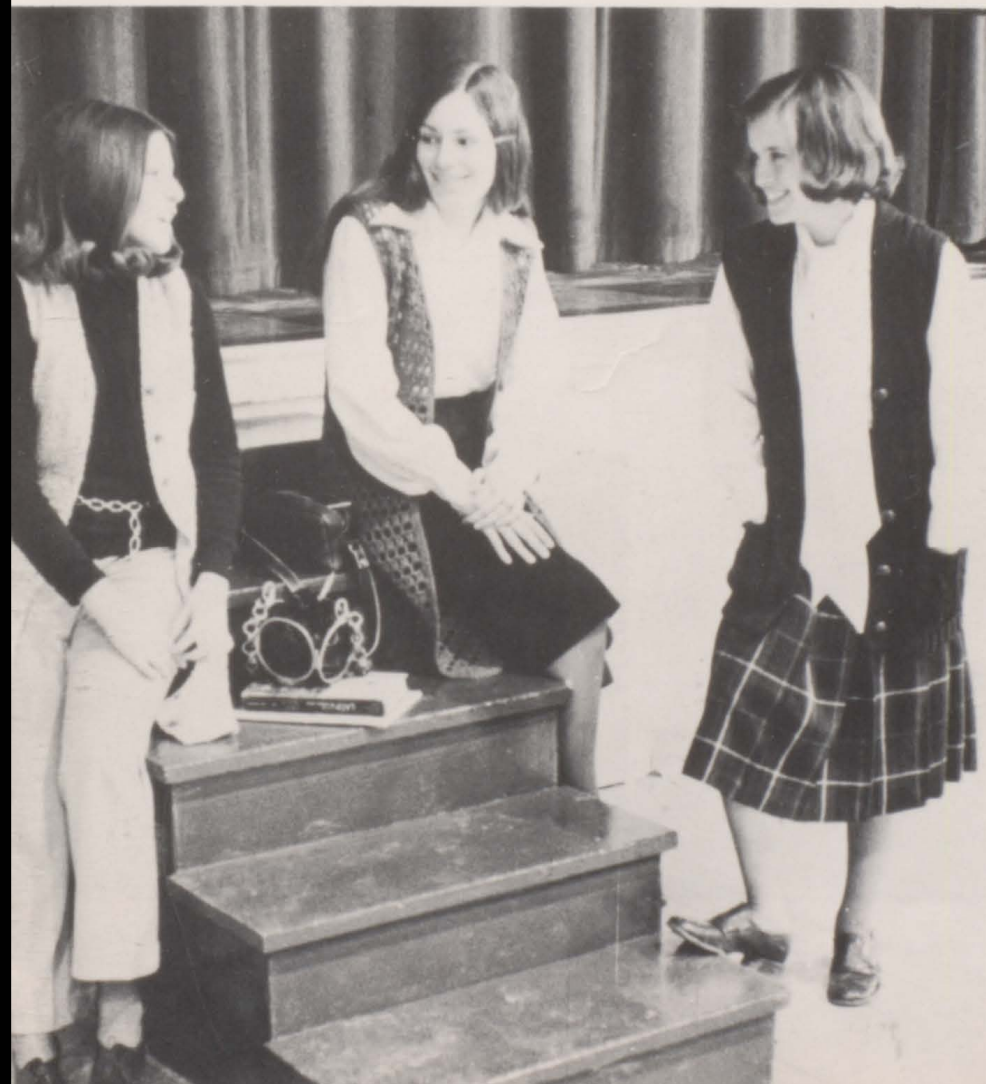
A revised dress code brought on all the latest in slacks and pant suits, much to the distress of some.

The last day of the trip was spent at colonial Williamsburg, Virginia, and Jamestown where it was exciting to see just how our ancestors got their start.

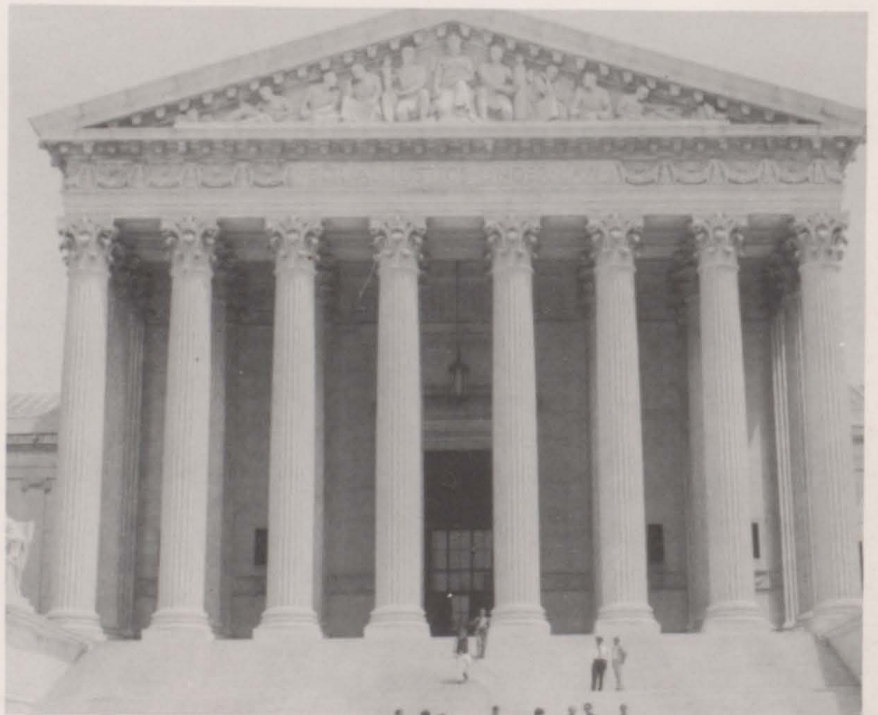
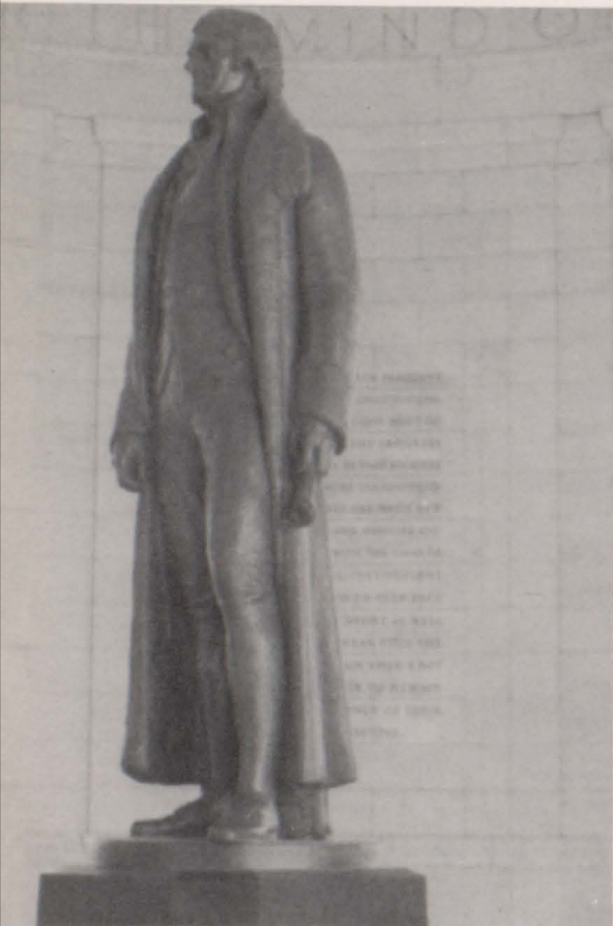

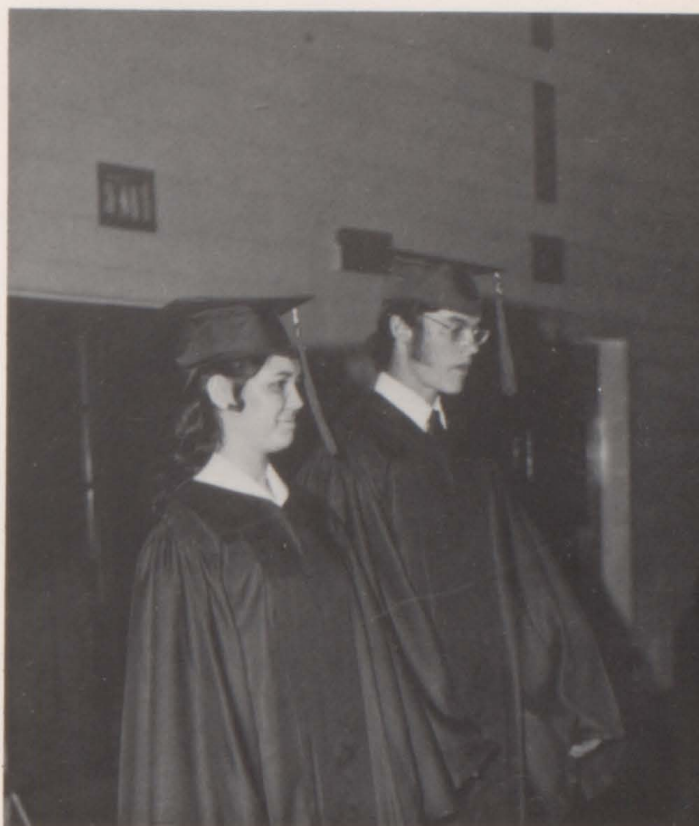

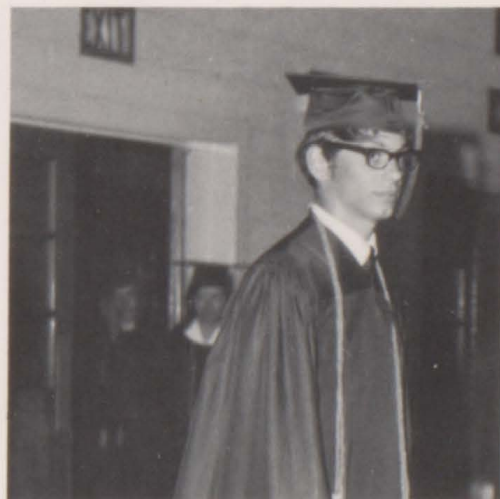

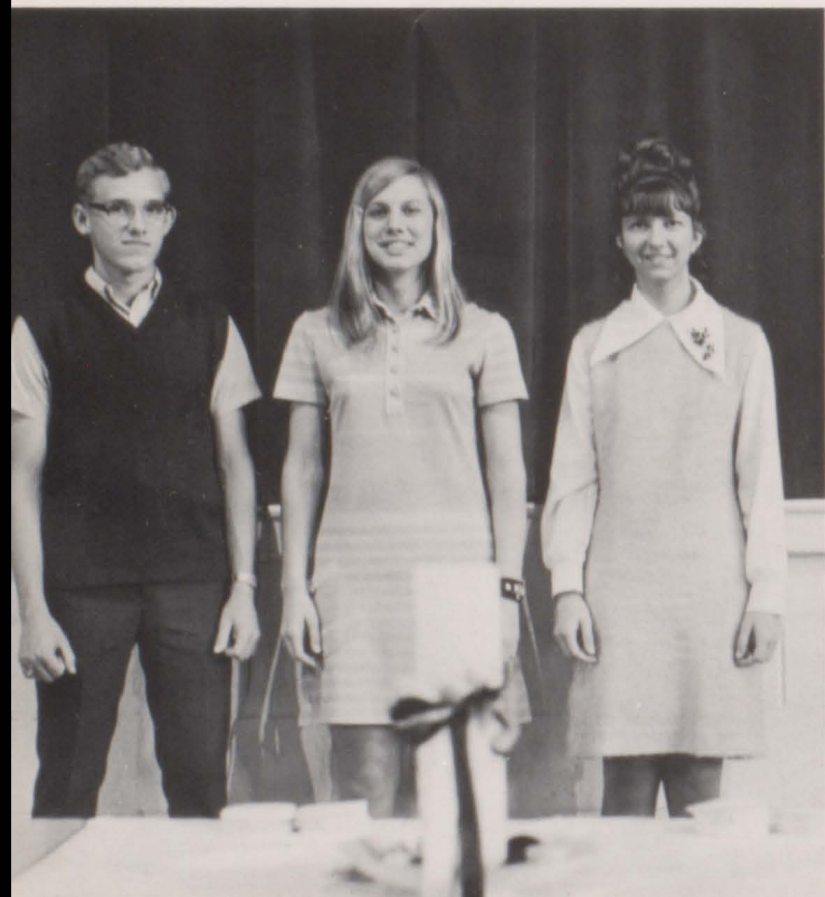

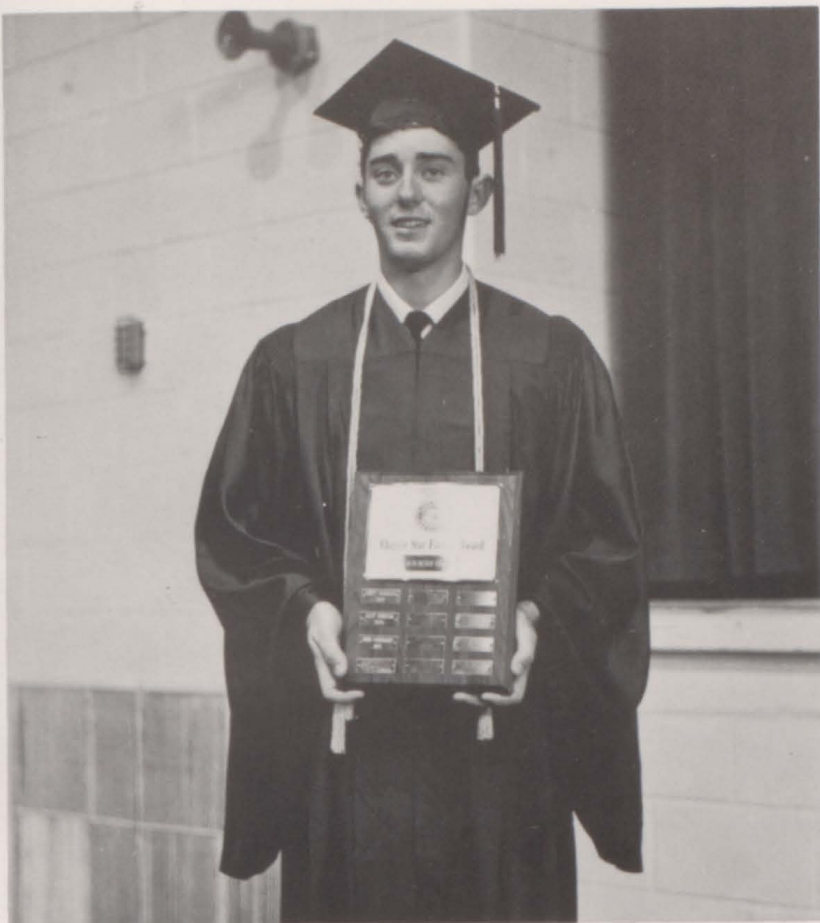

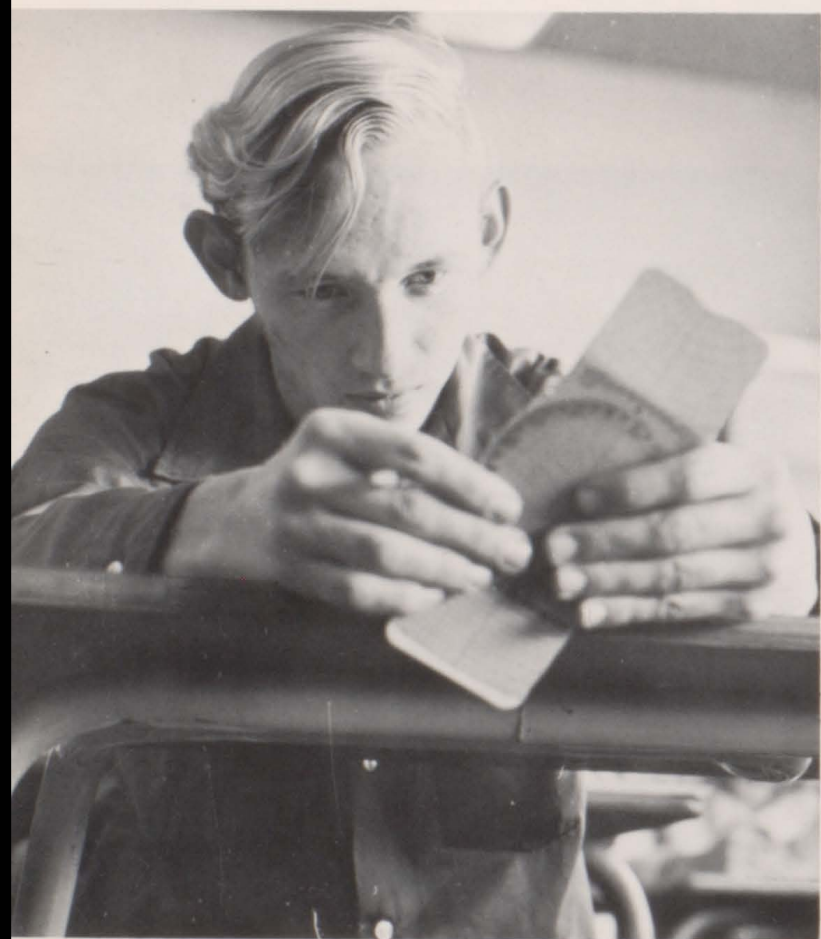

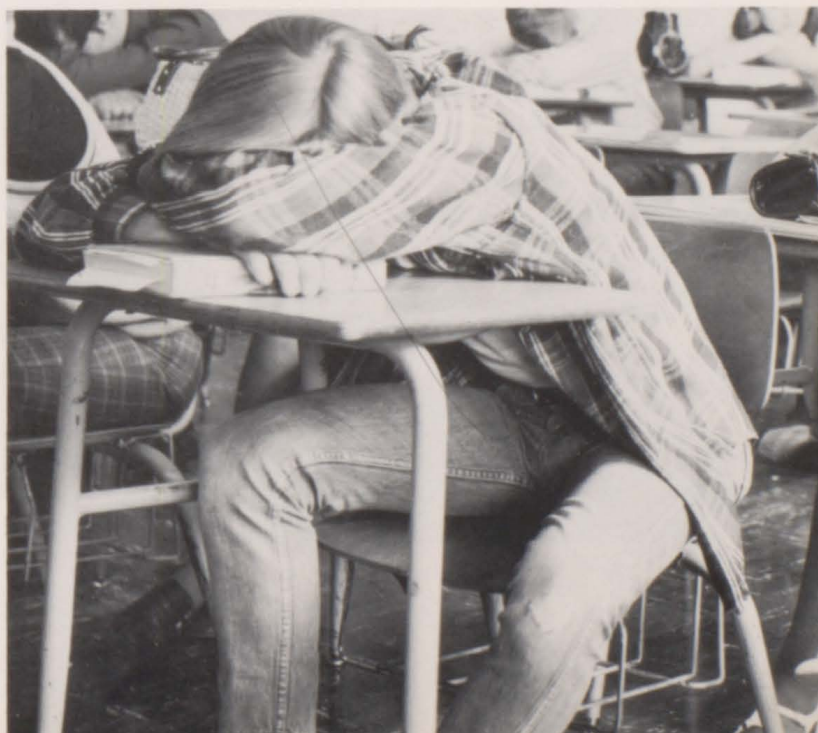

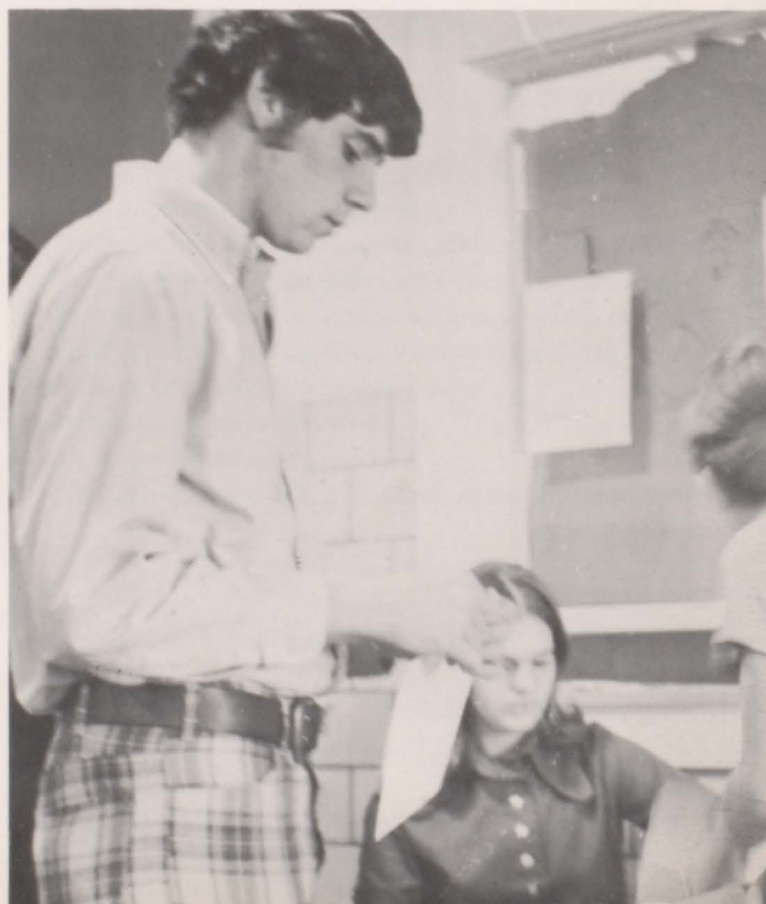

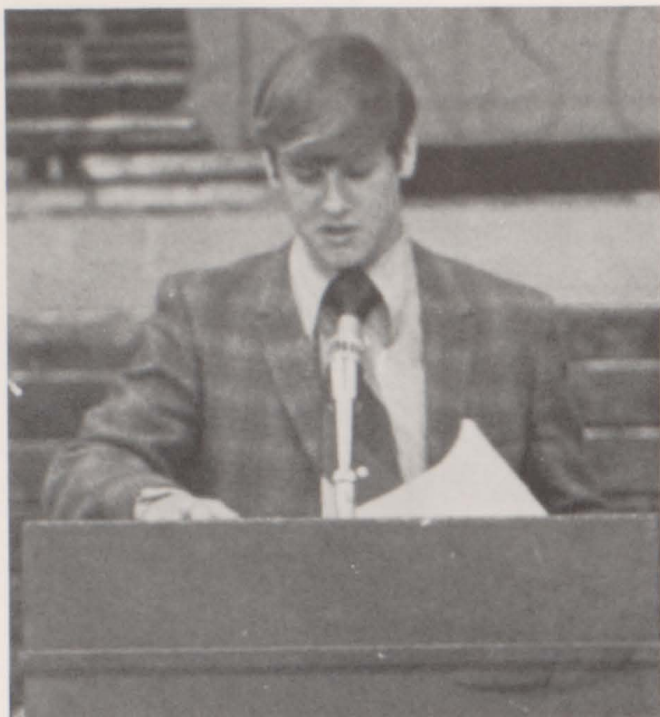


Practical Students Prepare for Life

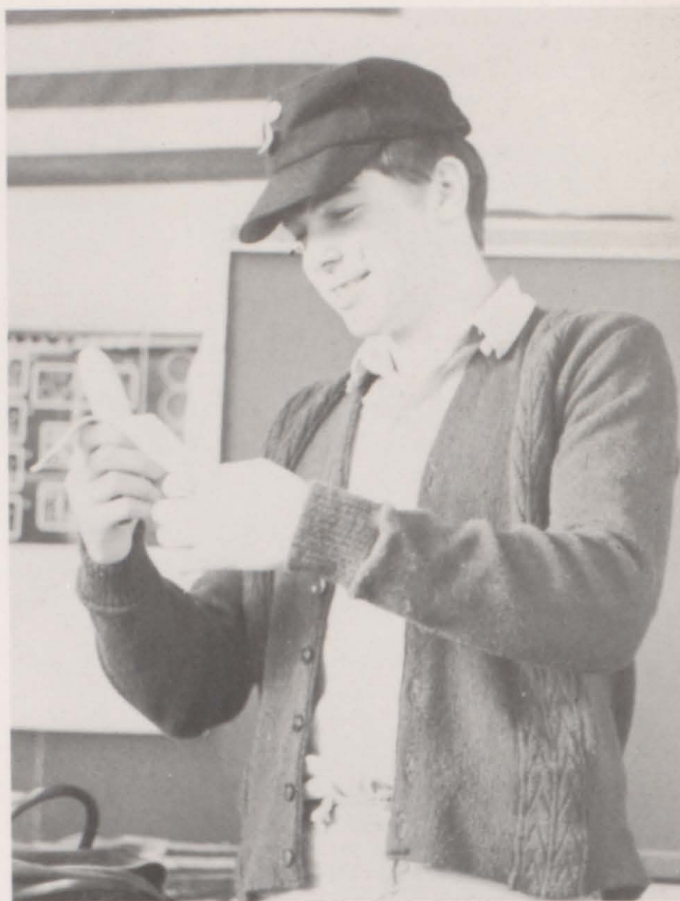

Marie Ensalmi, our exchange student from Chile was very warm and responsive to Hoosier hospitality and said she hated having to go back home.







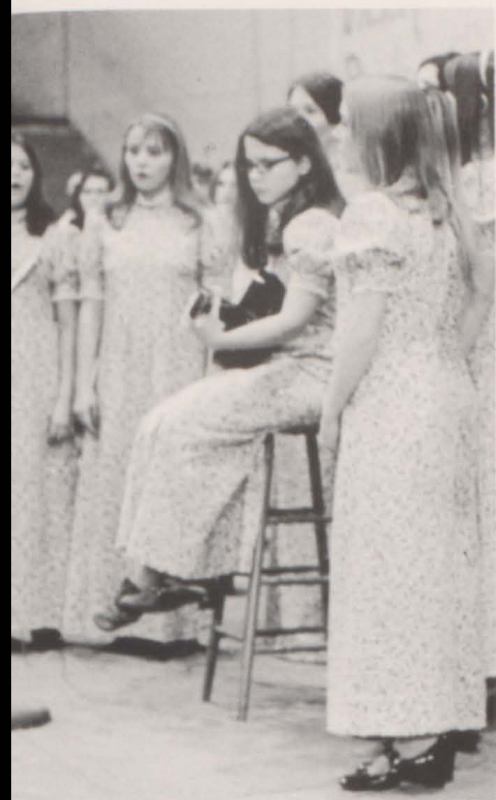

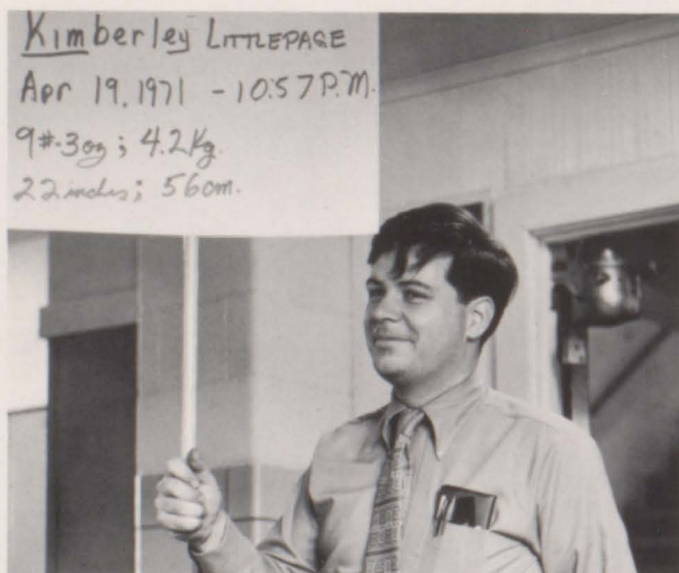

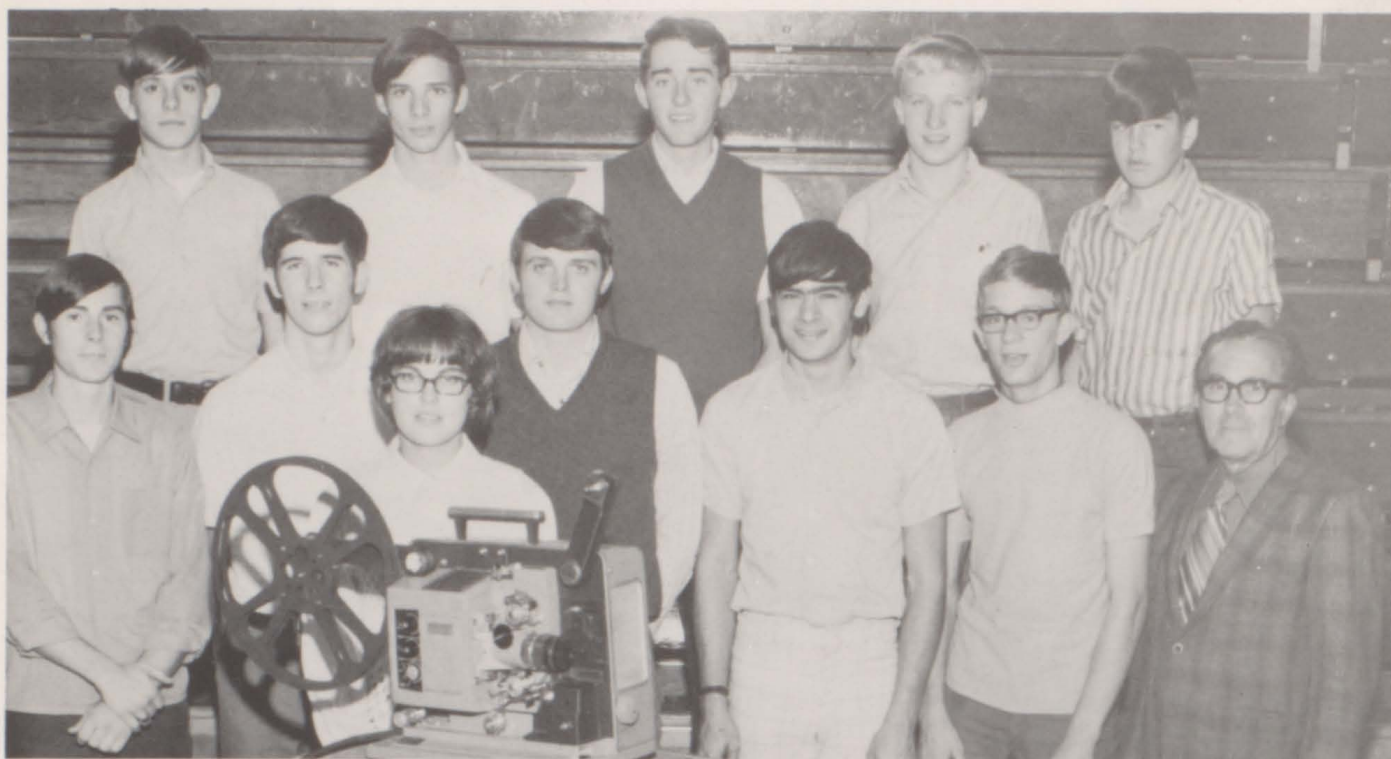
