Churubusco Schools Throughout History

CHURUBUSCO SCHOOLS THROUGHTOUT HISTORY



The first school in Churubusco was a one-room schoolhouse that looked similar to this one in rural Noble County. It was located on the west side of South Main Street (probably in the vicinity of where Mor For Less is currently located) and was first constructed in the early 1850's. After educating Churubusco's children during the week, the building also served as a place to worship on Sundays.



When the need arose for more room, the one-room schoolhouse was replaced by a 40 ft. x 70 ft. two-story building in 1875. This building, located on West Whitley Street (where the elementary playground is currently located), housed all grades and was built for the costly amount of \$4000. The first class graduated in 1886 (during those times, high school was only three years long instead of four).



In 1901, the previous school was torn down, and a new building was built on the same site. This building included a full basement with inside restrooms, and new manual training equipment was installed. This school soon became overcrowded, so in 1923 the school purchased abandoned World War I barracks from the government to use as additional classrooms.



In 1926, when the need for more and more space became evident, the school building was extensively remodelled. This allowed all twelve grades (by this time the law had been changed from three to four years for high school) to conduct classes in the same building. The remodelling also included the addition of a gym on the north side.



A new building came in the fall of 1956. It served as the high school, and included the present-day gym, Ms. Carroll's room, the teachers' lounge, locker rooms, part of the commons, and the first and second grade hallway. The elementary grades continued to conduct classes in the old building. The 1956 *Tusitala* quoted on its opening pages, "For them it was a dream, for us it is a reality."




In 1973 another extensive renovation began. The old building was torn down, and additions were made to our current building. The current high school commons, elementary gym, cafeteria, sophomore, junior, and 8th grade hallways, and the rest of the current elementary were added, and the elementary was moved to the new building. Also, the auditorium was built, and the stage in the gym was closed.

In 1963, the townships of Smith and Green combined to form Smith-Green Community Schools. At that time, the corporation had two elementary schools, Churubusco and Green Center. In 1983, Green Center closed, and all students were housed under one roof in Churubusco.





For almost twenty years, no major renovations were done. In 1990, some minor work included adding the current elementary office and improving the high school commons. The major change came in 1994, when construction began for a middle school for the 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. The construction was completed in the spring of 1995 (later than expected because of construction problems).



The Churubusco Schools yearbook used to be called *The Periscope*. The first issue was published in 1916 and contained all grades, elementary through high school. Not only were the year's events and student's portraits included, but also student artwork, stories, poems, and commentaries.

In 1948, *Tusitala* was chosen as the title of the yearbook. The American poet, Robert Louis Stevenson, was given the name "Tusitala" (which means "teller of tales") by the Samoan Indians. This title was a great honor to Stevenson, as it showed the Samoans loved his stories.


SCIENCE TEAM









"A Few Good Men," based on the Academy Award winning film of the same name, came to Churubusco in October of 1999. 
Christmas Dance









Although the team didn't win many meets, they are still winners because of their dedication to the sport and their willingness to give all they have.




































