What is one of your most memorable moments at CHS?
















A disturbing little story from the deceased...



GRADUATION 2003


A sunny day turned to an overcast and humid graduation evening, as the seniors gathered in the commons as high school students for the last time. Flowers










Churubusco's Most Successful Teams


















