On Thursday evening, we learned that Mary Hoffa, a beloved 20-year science teacher at Schenectady High School passed away in the hospital after battling an illness. Mary was known as a smart and kind woman who was adored and loved by all who knew her. She will also be missed dearly.

As we continue to mourn the loss of Samantha and Mary, we encourage parents to talk with their children. Keep in mind that death impacts each of us differently. There is no right way or wrong way. Kids may need to talk about it. Regardless of a child's age, you can help by listening carefully, not overreacting, and accepting their feelings. We will continue to work together as a school community to support our students, staff, and families during this difficult time.

At Wednesday's Board of Education Meeting I provided a status update on our Schenectady Revitalization Plan in regards to the development of a Family and Community Engagement Center. A few months ago, I asked the board for permission to pursue a facility within the city that could potentially serve as a-one-stop shop center for parents that would give them access to a variety of services including registration, transportation, parent resources, access to technology, training and opportunities, special education resources, onboarding for employment and much more. Our goal is to focus on creating a warm and friendly location that is a one-stop-shop for our families.

I'm pleased to say that we have identified a potential location that is available for this type of atmosphere. The location is the former OrthoNY building on Liberty St. in the center of downtown. It's near the library, city hall, on the public transportation route, and there is plenty of parking.

The board did grant me permission to consider this location for a lease or purchase option. I will be bringing more details back soon.

I also shared with the board that we met with the Albany Diocese regarding Keane Elementary School, which is a building we currently lease. I made the recommendation to lease the building for two more years and then we can re-assess as we move forward with planning and construction.

Both items, the lease or purchase of OrthoNY and the renewal of the Keane lease, would be required to be on the ballot for a community vote in May.

Congratulations to Damari Holder, a senior guard/forward on the Schenectady High School Basketball Team who was selected to NewsChannel 13's Basketball All-Star Team. Damari averaged 23 points and 10 rebounds this seaon for the Patriots.

I'm pleased to share that on Wednesday, the board of education approved the appointment of Edgar Glascott as Athletic Director. He has extensive coaching and athletic program and leadership experience. I look forward to what Edgar will do for our athletic program and student athletes. Athletics are an important part of how we continue to uplift our district and community. I am confident that under Edgar's leadership we will continue to move in the right direction.



We had a successful STEAM camp over the winter recess with more than 350 students participating each day. This is up from 60 students last year. We were impacted by the weather on one of the days. By all accounts students had a great time. It's a warm place to be with meals provided, tons of fun activities and it helps lessen the burden for parents who have to work. We look forward to our next camp which will be held over the April recess.


March is Women's History Month and Miss Ray's ENL classroom at Central Park is decorated for the occasion.

Thursday was National Teen Mental Wellness Day.


Our 9th Grade Center City Students celebrated by writing affirmations and engaging in reflective discussions with their classmates.
