I would like to highlight our PBIS and Restorative Practice initiatives that contribute so much to the creation of a positive climate within the school and an excellent mechanism for productively addressing problematic situations and behaviors. I see students and staff diligently engaged in these processes as the benefits to all can be seen so readily. We recently received the school's results from last spring's Maine Educational Assessment (MEA) and there are areas that are quite positive in the growth WHES students are exhibiting. In particular, our Reading results show increasing strength with a greater percentage of our students falling into the top two categories of being At or Above state standards. As is true throughout our RSU, our Mathematics results are not as positive and we are focused on taking the steps necessary to address these deficiencies. As a school, we continue to work on refining our curriculums, our instructional practices and our assessment protocols so as to serve our students even better. I sense a collective enthusiasm building within the staff, embracing best practice strategies to facilitate the growth of all WHES students. No school ever reaches perfection but, most importantly, the WHES staff remains focused on those practices that will advance our students in all realms (intellectual, social, emotional and physical) of their growth. The prospects are so very positive and together, with the support of the WHES parents and Whitefield community, we will continue to strive for excellence every day, remembering always that; "At WHES, We Have Pride Inside".
