Nebraska Society Professional Engineers (NeSPE)

NeSPE State Chapter-Scholarships for high school seniors are currently available from the Nebraska Society of Professional Engineers *State Chapter*. The criterion required is to enroll in an accredited engineering curriculum in the State of Nebraska. The State NeSPE scholarships are for \$1,500, and 2 scholarships are available.

NeSPE Eastern Chapter-Scholarships for high school seniors are also currently available from the Nebraska Society of Professional Engineers *Eastern Chapter*. The criteria required is to enroll in an accredited engineering curriculum in the State of Nebraska. The NeSPE Eastern Chapter scholarships are \$1,000, and 2 scholarships are available.

To qualify for either of the **Nebraska Society Professional Engineers (NeSPE) Scholarships**, the applicant must submit 1 copy of the attached application, teacher recommendations, employer recommendations (optional), essay, official transcripts, and SAT or ACT score sheet to the following address by **February 1, 2019**. The one application will qualify the applicant for both scholarships listed above.

The Maureen L. & Howard N. Blitman, P.E. Scholarship to Promote Diversity in Engineering Scholarship \$5,000 (Male or Female, 1 Scholarship, \$5,000 for freshman year, Deadline: March 1)

NOTE TO APPLICANT: For those scholarship recipients who receive a disbursement for consecutive years, NeSPE will require the scholarship recipient to furnish the Scholarship Committee with a "Confirmation of Enrollment" for the coming year prior to the disbursement of the scholarships checks. Should the scholarship recipient declare a major outside the field of engineering, or participate in an engineering program that is not accredited by ABET, the recipient will be deemed ineligible to receive funds from the scholarship program.
