WHEREAS, the Project is within the definition of a "project" for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); and

WHEREAS, the Guidelines for CEQA, California Code of Regulations Title 14, Chapter 13 ("State CEQA Guidelines"), exempt certain projects from further CEQA evaluation, including projects consisting of the new construction or conversion of small structures ("Class 3 Exemption;" Cal.
