EMERGENCY NURSING SERVICES

The Barneveld School District has developed policies and protocols that address the safety and wellness of all students. These policies have been approved by the Barneveld School District Board of Education.

453.1 RULE 1

BARNEVELD SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Barneveld School District has developed policies and protocols in cooperation with a Registered Nurse, school district personnel, and community health agencies to serve as a guide when administering care to students.

Standard G requires that emergency nursing policies dealing with illness management, accidental injury, and medication administration be implemented at all school-sponsored activities. Any activity that is school-based or sponsored is considered a curricular, or co-curricular, or extra-curricular activity. This includes all field trips (in-state and out-of-state), summer school, homework club, sports practices and events, recreational clubs, etc. School-sponsored activities before or after the school day and on weekends are also included.

Policies and Protocols

- Management of Allergies

Medical Advisors are required to be a licensed physician (Wis. Admin. Code sec. PI8.01(g) 3). Medical Advisors may provide standing orders for emergency medication administration in the Barneveld School District.

The Barneveld School District has developed a Medication and Treatment policy that addresses safe administration of medications and treatments, handling of medications including controlled substances, storage of medications, and medication errors. This policy also addresses parent/guardian authorization, healthcare provider authorization, training requirements and delegation of medication/treatment administration.

The Barneveld School District has developed a Communicable Disease Policy that addresses pupil illness.

State law mandates that School Districts in Wisconsin have the necessary equipment and supplies available for emergency nursing services (Wis. Admin. Code sec PI 8.01(2)(g)). Barneveld School District has a list of emergency equipment and resources for staff to use when a District RN is not on site. The Barneveld School District also maintains a current list for emergency information for each student within the district. This information is readily accessible to all school personnel who may need to respond in case of an emergency.

BARNEVELD SCHOOL DISTRICT

SPECIALIZED STUDENT HEALTH CARE SERVICES

Students with special health care needs, i.e., who have chronic illnesses, who are medically fragile and/or who are technologically dependent may need specialized health care and procedures in school.

In serving students with specialized health needs, nurses, physicians, allied health professionals and family members who have expertise in caring for the child or youth with health impairment are crucial in the decisions relative to the care to be provided at school. By utilizing the expertise of health professionals together with a deliberate and systematic planning process, a sound educational program can be developed which will protect and promote the health and safety of the student and provide the student a safe and productive learning environment.

A student may receive special health care services at school as determined by a team upon written request of a parent/guardian, along with written orders from the licensed physician(s) managing the student's medical care and under a health care plan directed and supervised by a school nurse in compliance with federal and state statutes and guidelines.
