Mission Statement


The mission of Hoxie School District is to promote a culture of lifelong learning, in which all students excel, in a safe environment that values and respects diversity where students are vested in their future.




Changes to State Reports for Testing

- Due to the extraordinary circumstances created by the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting school closures, states were provided flexibility regarding the assessment and accountability requirements under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Given the widespread, extended school closures, and the interruption in school operations and on-site classroom education, Arkansas canceled administration of state testing for the spring of 2020.
 - ACT Aspire
 - Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)
 - K-2 assessments.
- No letter grade or ESSA score was given assigned for the 2020-2021 school year.
- For the 2021-2022 school year, ESSA scores were given without letter grades.
- For the 2022-2023 school year, schools will receive both ESSA scores and letter grades.

Elementary County Comparison







Hoxie Schools ACT Aspire State, School, & Goal Comparison Percent Meeting or Exceeding Readiness Benchmarks



Hoxie Elementary School ACT Aspire State, School, & Goal Comparision Percent Meeting or Exceeding Readiness Benchmarks




Hoxie High School ACT Aspire State, School, & Goal Comparison Percent Meeting or Exceeding Readiness Benchmarks

Assessment Updates

Grades K-2

- Continue Renaissance Star Assessments in math and literacy
 - Administered at least three times throughout the year to monitor student learning and help drive instruction
 - Immediate feedback for teachers

Grades 3-11

- Continue Renaissance Star Assessments in math and literacy to help drive instruction
 - Administered at least three times during the year
 - Provide real-time data to help drive instruction focusing on individual student needs
 - Immediate feedback for teachers
- ACT Aspire
 - Administered in the spring
 - Receive results in the summer
 - 2022 2023 will be the last year

NIET Partnership

- Grant through the Arkansas Rural Educator Network to support educators through district partnerships to provide in-depth support
 - Funded by the Walton Family Foundations totaling close to \$200,000 over 3 years
 - Extended to 4 years
- NIET conducted a strengths-based needs assessment and collaboratively developed a support plan with the district leaders
- NIET will work alongside the district team to continually monitor, reflect, and adjust support as needed
- Effective Professional Learning Committees (PLCs) will be implemented through facilitated support from NIET

PEER Network Partner School

- PEER (Promoting Educator Effectiveness in Rural Arkansas) is an provided by a grant awarded to the Arkansas Public School Resource Center through the U.S. Department of Education to raise student growth and academic achievement and to close the achievement gap between highand low-performing students.
- The PEER network utilizes a Performance-Based Compensation System (PBCS) to support and promote educator effectiveness in rural Arkansas schools.

PEER Teacher Leaders

- Teacher leaders are those who are respected by their peers, are continuous learners, and support the growth of their peers through distributed leadership.
- Through the PEER network, designated teacher leaders will receive training, coaching, and job-embedded support through personalized performance management by a PEER Coach.
- PEER Leaders will share new learning with other teachers in the school.

Professional Development: Summer 2022

- Science of Reading
 — teachers across the district were trained on implementing Amplify CKLA, utilizing SoR Look-For documents, and analyzing data for grouping to meet the science of reading
- Accelerated Learning— teachers learned to analyze reliable data sources to determine trends in student needs and examine an approach to accelerated student learning to support learning through standards and data trend analysis.
- FLVS Hoxie Online Academy teachers were trained on using the Florida Virtual School curriculum to provide instruction for our online students
- Family and Community Engagement— teachers learned steps they can take to invite caregivers into the daily operations of schools and broaden the definition of parental involvement toward a more inclusive, community-based definition that encompasses all types of caregivers
- Universal Design for Learning (UDL)— teachers examined the purpose of UDL and knowledge and application of high-quality classroom instruction for all students, including students with disabilities
- Homelessness Bus drivers learned to identify the signs of homelessness and steps for reporting it (Teachers will be trained at a later date.)

AR Teacher Residency Model Allows high school students and paraprofessionals to become a certified teacher for FREE
