Welcome to Crestview Local Schools

I am excited and grateful to continue to serve as superintendent of Crestview Local School District. I consider it an honor to serve as Superintendent of Schools in a district that has overwhelming support from the community. As we know, the school is the center of the district, and we must continue to make it a place where parents, staff, community leaders, and students all are proud to say that they live in an amazing school district. We can only do this with your support and working together collaboratively.

The summer seems to have come and gone very quickly as we have many great things going on in the district. Some are more visible and obvious than others, but all are important to the growth and development of our district.

When students return on Wednesday, August 17, our goal is to provide a safe, healthy, and student-centered learning environment.

Our custodial and maintenance staff take pride in preparing the buildings for the 1st day of school and have been very busy preparing our buildings for the upcoming year. They are to be commended for their excellent work.

We have many exciting projects in progress or finished this summer. Outside/exterior projects included roof repairs to all three buildings, focusing on the middle school as it had the greatest need. For the safety of our fans and those with mobility issues, we added sidewalks to the visitor and home bleachers. We do plan to investigate new bleachers that will provide a wheelchair seating area. For the safety of our fans, we have removed the wood light poles that some say are the original poles. We have installed new high-efficiency LED lighting and light poles at the stadium.

The board approved the purchase of a total of three new buses over the past year, they have arrived and will be on routes at the beginning of the school year. We have added a red corrugated PVC cap to both the softball and baseball fields. New flooring and new toilet fixtures were installed in elementary school restrooms. In the high school, the library is going through a facelift with new carpet and furniture. Unfortunately, due to delays, the furniture will not be here by the start of school. All though this list is not inclusive of everything, it does show that the district has made a commitment to keeping our facilities in good order.

The board has also invested in the classroom. Every math and science classrooms and the third and fourth-grade classrooms will have a 75" interactive display panel installed before school begins. Our tech department and a couple of teachers researched, tested and reviewed three different manufactured brands to make sure we were getting what works best for our district.

The ELA English Language Arts department will have a new curriculum with K-5 adopting the Wonders Curriculum by McGraw Hill. Our staff reviewed other curricula before deciding to move forward with Wonders. The curriculum also comes highly recommended by Mid Ohio Educational Service Center ELA specialists.

A newly created Project Lead The Way (PLTW) STEM position and course offerings are coming to the middle school next year. Mrs. Blackledge will be teaching Green Architecture and Coding Apps, while Mr. Hays will teach Robotics & Automation and Flight & Space to 7th and 8th-grade students. Mr. Hays will also Teach a PLTW program called Launch to our 5th and 6th grade students.

Pro-Core and i-Ready assessments will be used during the 22-23 school year. i-Ready will replace the NWEA assessment, which many are familiar with. These new assessment tools will provide teachers with valuable data to help improve instruction.

This past spring, we had students, staff, and community members help develop a Portrait of a Grad. Students from Mrs. Ott's class presented to our board a poster and flyer ideas that will be used to promote Crestview's version of a Portrait of a Grad.

Finally, I want to thank the members of the School Board for entrusting me to lead our school district and for their support of our staff and students.





Foster a commitment within the district to achieve a level of academic excellence by allocating the resources necessary.	The Board thoroughly investigated academic needs within the district and allocated finances and personnel where needed to best serve Crestview students. The financial position of the district remains stable.
Maintain personnel costs at 81% [or less] of General Fund revenues.	The total amount spent on General Fund salaries and benefits for FY22 was 70% of revenues. Personnel costs are the district's largest expenditure and presents a challenge as the district attempts to maintain excellent educational programs for students.

Address projected deficit spending in General Fund.	The district did not experience expenditures exceeding revenues for FY22. The district will need to keep a close eye on the future of state funding and property valuations due to 94% of the districts revenue coming from these sources

For Your Information

Annual District Notices

Notification of Rights under FERPA for Elementary and Secondary Schools: The *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)* affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after
 the day the District receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students
 should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written
 request that identifies the records they wish to inspect. The school official will
 make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time
 and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA. Parents or eligible students who wish to ask the school to amend a record should write the school principal (or appropriate school official), clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel) or a person serving on the School Board. A school official also may include a volunteer or contractor outside of the school who performs an institutional service of function for which the school would otherwise use its own employees and who is under the direct control of the school with respect to the use and maintenance of PII from education records, such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist; a parent or student volunteering to serve on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee; or a parent, student, or other volunteer assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled if the disclosure is for purposes of the student's enrollment or transfer.
- 4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20202

(FERPA) NOTICE FOR DIRECTORY INFORMATION: The *Family Educational Rights And Privacy Act (FERPA)*, is a Federal Law, requires that Crestview Local School District, with certain exceptions obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from you child's education records. However, Crestview Local School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the district to the contrary in accordance with district procedures. The primary purpose of the directory information is to allow the Crestview Local School District to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications.

Examples include:

- A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production;
- The annual yearbook;
- Honor Roll or other recognition lists;
- Graduation programs; and
- Sports activity sheet, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.
- Local Report Card distribution to parents.

Directory information, which is information that is generally considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings, or publish yearbooks. In addition, two Federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the *ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT OF 1965 (ESEA)* to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories - names, addresses and telephone listings - unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their student' information disclosed without their prior written consent.

If you do not want Crestview Local School District to disclose any or all items as directory information from your child's education records without prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing within two weeks of this notice. Crestview Local School District has designated the following information as directory information:

Student name Participation in officially recognized activities & sports

Address Weight and height of members of athletic teams

Telephone listing Degrees, honors, and awards received

Date of Graduation The most recent educational agency or institution

Date and place of birth attended

Major field of study Date of attendance Grade level

These laws are: Section 9528 of the ESEA (20 u.s.c. 7908), as amended by the *NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001* (P.I.. 107-110), the legislation that provides funding for the Nation's Armed Forces.

Each year federal and state law requires that we inform the residents of our school district of certain specific items.

AEDs: Are available in all buildings to be used, if necessary, by individuals who have the required training. For more information contact Crestview Local Board of Education office at 419-895-1700, ext. 17000.

ASBESTOS: This management plan is on file and available for inspection in the office of the Superintendent.

ARMED FORCES RECRUITERS: The school district is required to provide, upon request, the Armed Forces recruiters access to names, addresses, and telephone numbers of students unless the parent requests a prior written consent to the release. Forms are available in the High School Office.

CHILD FIND: Local educational agencies are required under Federal Regulation 34 CFR 300.220 to initiate an awareness campaign to locate, identify and evaluate children with disabilities who may need special education or related services. This campaign is known as "Child Find." Parents, relatives, public and private agencies and concerned citizens can help school districts find any child, age birth through 21 years, who may have a disability and need special education or related services. If you are aware of a Crestview child who may have special needs and is currently not being served, please call 419-895-1700.

FUND RAISERS: Any group or organizations (school or community) that wishes to solicit funds or conduct fund-raisers on school property must first obtain permission from the Superintendent. The appropriate form is available at the Board Office

HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS: All Crestview Local School District teachers meet Highly Qualified (HQT) requirements.

IDEA-B: The Crestview Local School District provides educational services to students with disabilities utilizing federal assistance through IDEA-B funds to enhance the basic program. An application is on file at the District's Administrative Building and is available for examination and recommendations by District residents. To provide input on the budget, please send input by May 1. Questions or suggestions should be directed to: Director of Special Education, 1575 State Route 96, Ashland, OH 44805. Phone: 419-895-1700.

IMMUNIZATIONS: Beginning with the 2016-17, all pupils entering 7th & 12th grades fall under new requirements. Immunization requirements are available on our website.

LEP STUDENTS: Provisions have been implemented to identify any Limited English Proficient (LEP) students and to make appropriate educational provisions as required by NCLB.

NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION: The Crestview Local School District does not discriminate on the basis of sex in the education programs or activities it operates, nor in admission to or employment in its education program or activities.

NOTICE OF PARENTAL RIGHTS UNDER SECTION 504: Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act is a nondiscrimination statute barring discrimination on the basis of one's disability. It is the policy of the school district not to discriminate on the basis of disability in its education programs, activities or employment policies as required by the Act. The Act requires the school district to locate, evaluate and determine if the student is a qualified individual requiring accommodation necessary to provide access to educational programs. Parents are entitled to have the opportunity to review relevant educational records under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Parents or guardians disagreeing with the decisions reached by school personnel for accommodations necessary for access to educational programming and/ or facilities may request a hearing before an impartial hearing officer by notifying the school principal. SCREENINGS: Annually the school district conducts physical exams or screenings on students. The Richland County Public Health Department recommendations are as follows:

Scoliosis Screening in Grades 6, 7, 8

Any other physical exams or screenings require prior notification to parents.

CRESTVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 2021-2022 Annual Report

Third Grade Reading Guarantee Results: The state average for proficiency was 50%. In the fall, Crestview had 65% of our students meet or exceed proficiency on the standardized state test, which is 15% higher than the state average. We are still waiting for Spring results to get our final numbers. The scores will be released on June 15, 2022.

Third Grade Math Results: The state average for proficiency was 59%. Crestview had 68% of our students meet or exceeded proficiency on the standardized state test, which is 9% higher than the state average.

Student Enrollment:

Kindergarten = 68 1st Grade = 60 2nd Grade = 72 3rd Grade = 69 Overall Building Total = 269.

Student-Teacher Ratio:

Kindergarten = 22:1 1st Grade = 20:1 2nd Grade = 18:1 3rd Grade = 23:1

Overall Building Student to Teacher Ratio = 20:1.

Student Attendance:

Kindergarten = 94.6% 1st Grade = 95.1% 2nd Grade = 95.0% 3rd Grade = 96.3%. Overall Building Total = 95.3%.



Building Goals for 2021-2022:

1. To reduce the number of students school-wide K-3 grades who are on Reading Improvement Monitoring Plans (RIMPS), by 20% by the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

Outcome: We reduced the overall total number of students by 18%.

2. To have 95% or more of our 3rd graders who take the Third Grade Reading Guarantee test pass the state standards in Literacy.

Outcome: We still have not yet received our Spring scores, but the results from the Fall test indicated that 65% of our 3rd graders passed the Third Grade Reading Guarantee in their first attempt.

Building Goals for 2022-2023:

- 1. Fully implement PBIS systems and to be recognized as a Bronze Level school by the state.

GOALS: Goals for the high school are:

• To show growth for all students through the end of the 2022-2023 school year as measured by classroom, district, and national assessments.

• Maintain parent and community engagement through consistent and purposeful opportunities for involvement and communication throughout each school year.

CHS PROGRAM OF STUDIES: Twenty (20) credits are required for graduation. A total of 59 units of credit are offered in the high school

ACADEMICS: We have seen a continued increase in the participation of College Credit Plus program: 46 students took CCP classes. This included 30 seniors, 24 juniors, 1 sophomore and 1 freshman. These students completed their courses through the following local colleges and universities: The Ohio State University, Ashland University and North Central State College. During the 2021-2022 school year Pre-Calculus, and Calculus were offered on our high school campus through Urbana Franklin University while English Composition 1010 and 1030 will be offered through North Central State College for college credit.

INDUSTRY RECOGNIZED CREDENTIALS (SHOP CLASS): Our Art department saw much success as students were recognized at our school art show, Artapalooza (Mid-Ohio ESC, Mansfield) the Ohio Governor's Show, and the Scholastic Awards. We have also added college and career readiness content to our fine arts courses. Our Portfolio class, which is a college preparatory art class, continues to see an increase in enrollment. Additionally, the Ohio Arts Council provided a visiting artist through a grant opportunity. The visiting artist provided professional development for teaching staff and provided teaching assistance. Over the last several years the visiting artist has designed and completed murals in all three buildings in our district.

FFA: Our FFA program has much to celebrate. The Crestview FFA chapter was recognized as a Silver Rated Chapter. This is state level recognition. On an individual level, students in our FFA program have received numerous accolades and recognitions. We had many students competing in the rural soils, parliamentary procedures, food science CDE, public speaking, vet science, and livestock judging contests. The dairy foods team consisting of Rylynn Baker, Starbella Cordrey, Baileigh Cordrey and Makayla Spoerr were 1st in the district and 10th in the state. State winning proficiency was awarded to Grayson Littleton in the area of Agriculture Education for his presentation of Steam Engines. He will compete at nationals in the Fall. Destiny Lafever was 3rd overall in the state with her Vet Science proficiency. State Degrees were awarded to Makayla Spoerr.

Post High School Plans, Class of 2022 - We took a survey of our graduating class of 2021-22. One of the main questions pertained to the students' plans after high school graduation. The following data was reported regarding student plans: 2-Year College; 34; 4-Year College: 8; Enlisting Military Service: 4; Entering Workforce: 32; Undecided: 4.

STUDENTS: Crestview High School had 357 high school students this past year with 56 students attending Pioneer Career and Technology Center. The teacher ratio is 17:1. Our attendance percentage was 95.25%.

GRADUATION and SCHOLARSHIPS: The Class of 2022 graduated 82 students on May 22, 2022. We announced many of the local scholarships at our annual senior awards night. Scholarships were provided by organizations such as the Richland County Foundation, Ashland County Foundation, Crestview Educational Foundation, Crestview FFA Alumni and the Crestview Teachers' Association.

FACILITY: Throughout the 2021-2022 school year, the building saw continued use this year by all of the schools. Despite the numerous COVID-19 health safety protocols, we still continued to utilize the school facilities for community functions ranging from sports, music concerts, drama productions, and group meetings were still a regular occurrence at the high school. We were able to adapt to the health safety protocols by changing venue locations and adjusting seating options. Although outside organizations did not use the building during the 2021-2022 school year, we saw a gradual increase in usage as we went through the school year. Something that really enhanced our community was the completion of the stadium turf project. The stadium was used by the high school, middle school, and elementary school, as well as outside organizations and sports programs. The all weather field was used for PE classes, PBIS rewards events, and school sponsored field days. The first event that was hosted on the turf was an all community reading event where high school students read to elementary students under the stadium lights.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT: Our GAP (Gaining Academic Progress) period remained and continued to give students the opportunity to receive teacher assistance on completion of class work, remediation, and tutoring. Throughout the school year we adjusted students' GAP schedules so they were placed in GAP classes that would best meet their academic needs. We also continued to offer an after school study tables program on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, from 3:15-4:30 p.m. in the media center. In March we added an additional after school study table session on Wednesdays and offered transportation for students. During the 2021-2022 school year we saw an average of around 15-20 students attending each session.

ATHLETICS: Our athletics program continued to thrive during the 2021-2022 school year. The Football team won the Firelands Conference title and reached the Regional Semifinals in the State Playoffs - losing to eventual State Champion Carey. The Girls Cross Country won the Firelands Conference, while Tommy O'Neill and Morgan Welch earned All-Ohio honors by placing 14th and 24th respectively. The Girls Soccer team brought home both the Conference and Sectional titles. Winter sports, Girls Basketball won their 3rd Conference Title in a row and claimed a Sectional Title as well. Hayden Kuhn placed 4th at the State Wrestling Tournament. Spring sports, Boys Track were back to back Conference, District and Regional Champion and sent 12 athletes to the State Meet. The 4x800m relay team and Shawn Bailey made All-Ohio by placing 7th and 8th respectively. Morgan Welch represented the Girls Track team qualifying for State in the 1600m event. The Boys Baseball finished the Conference Runners-up.
