<p>High-Quality Instructional Resources (HQIRs) High expectations for all students are established by utilizing research-based/externally validated high-quality instructional resources that are both challenging and aligned with the grade-level Kentucky academic standards.</p>	<p>Students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Interact with standards-aligned resources, along with various forms of media (print, multimedia, software, etc.), to reach their intended learning outcomes. <p>Teachers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilize the high-quality instructional resources provided by the district consistently. • Differentiate lessons to meet the diverse needs of their students. <p>Leaders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that district-purchased high-quality instructional resources are available for all subjects and are being used consistently. • Obtain resources that are research-based and/or externally validated. • Ensure professional learning is provided for school/district-purchased HQIRs.
<p>Instructional Practices A variety of research-proven instructional strategies and techniques are used to support all students in learning the content of the lesson.</p>	<p>Students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contribute to the whole class by actively listening and teaching each other. • Engage in critical thinking and expect productive struggle and perseverance in solving problems in the face of difficulty.

	<p>Teachers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employ explicit instruction strategies (gradual release of instruction, modeling, think-alouds). • Provide opportunities for student choice. • Provide scaffolding and interventions to students as needed. <p>Leaders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide professional learning opportunities and modeling for teachers to develop common instructional goals and consistency in schools. • Provide ongoing coaching and support to teachers. • Provide and protect PLC time for educators to meet and plan, and align lessons to grade-level standards. • Actively involved in PLC's with teachers

<p>Assessments Ongoing assessments are a staple in all of our classrooms, and the data gained from these assessments are used to make instructional decisions that facilitate learning for all students.</p>	<p>Students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give best effort on all of their assessments. • Use teacher or peer feedback to improve their answers on assessments when applicable. <p>Teachers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deliberately check for student understanding throughout class/unit. • Provide immediate, actionable feedback to students in order to improve work. • Use assessment data to make instructional decisions for both whole class as well as for individual students. <p>Leaders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Examine interim assessment data to make instructional decisions for their school. • Create a school culture in which doing your best on assessments is the expectation.
