

Blizzard Bag Day Two

Playing the game:

Object of the game: To be the player that makes the largest number in each category.

Number of players: 2 or more

1. To decide who goes first, each player rolls one of the dice. The player with the highest roll goes first.
2. On your turn, roll all of the dice. *I like to have my students roll the dice into a small plastic container so that the dice don't roll onto the floor.*
3. Use all of the dice that you just rolled to create a number. You may place the dice in any order to create the number. For example, if you rolled 4, 1, and 6, you may create 416, 461, 146, 164, 614, or 641.
- If playing "Place Value Yahtzee 3-digit," you'll create a 3-digit number using three dice.
 - If playing "Place Value Yahtzee 4-digit," you'll create a 4-digit number using four dice.
 - If playing "Place Value Yahtzee 6-digit," you'll create a 6-digit number using six dice.
4. If you are unable to fill in a number for any category at the end of your turn, place an ZX beside any available category.
5. At the end of the game, compare the number you wrote in each category with the number the other players wrote. Whoever wrote the greater number for that category circles it and receives one point.
6. The player with the most points (circled categories) is the winner.
