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**Freshman Math Courses**

Freshmen can only take Geometry H with a teacher recommendation or if they have passed Algebra I in 8th grade with an 80% B- or better, passed 8th grade science with a 90% or higher and scored a “3” or higher on their 8th grade Science EOC and Algebra I EOC.

Freshmen who scored below 80% in Algebra I as an 8th grader and scored below a “3” on their Algebra I EOC MUST retake Algebra I

Freshmen that took 8th grade Algebra Skills MUST take Algebra I.

**Freshman Foreign Language Courses**

Freshmen can take Spanish II if they have passed Spanish I in 8th grade with an 80% B- or better.

Freshmen who scored below 80% in Spanish I as an 8th grader MUST take Spanish I.

**Freshman Sciences Courses**

Freshmen can only take Biology I H with a teacher recommendation or if they have passed Algebra I in 8th grade with an 80% B- or better, passed 8th grade science with a 90% or higher and scored a “3” or higher on their 8th grade Science EOC and Algebra I EOC.

**Freshman Social Studies and English courses**

Freshmen can only take English I H with a teacher recommendation or if they passed 8th grade English with an 80% B- or better and scored a “3” or higher on their 8th grade English EOC.

If a student is placed in honors English, he or she also will be placed in honors social studies.

**PE Waiver**

Students in grades 9-11 may be excused from the physical education course requirement by participating in District-sponsored interscholastic athletics, marching band, or cheerleading for at least two (2) athletic seasons.

**Graduation Pathways**

In addition to current course requirements, students must meet one of the following three pathways to earn a diploma:

<b>1</b>	Earn a cumulative passing score of 18 on seven end-of course exams. To ensure students are well rounded, they must earn a minimum of four points in math, four points in English and six points across science and social studies. The scores will be set by the State Board of Education. Courses that have an end of course exam include English I, English II, Algebra, Geometry, Biology, American history, and American government.
<b>2</b>	Students earn “remediation-free” scores in English language arts and mathematics on a nationally recognized college admission exam. A remediation free score is English (18), Reading (22), and Math (22). The state of Ohio will pay one time for all 11th grade students in the classes of 2018 and beyond to take the ACT free of charge.
<b>3</b>	Students earn 12 points through a State Board of Education-approved, industry-recognized credential or group of credentials in a single career field and achieve a workforce readiness score of 13 on the WorkKeys assessment. The state of Ohio will pay one time for those who take the WorkKeys assessment.
