Poverty Simulation

Poverty is a reality for many individuals and families. If you have never experienced poverty then it is difficult to understand. A Poverty Simulation bridges the gap from misconception to understanding. During a Poverty Simulation, individuals take on the identity of someone living in poverty. You will work together with your family to **live a month in poverty**. Your simulated "community" is a large room, and the services you need such as banks, schools, grocery stores line the perimeter of the room. Like real life, you need transportation to work or school, you need food on the table, you might struggle with a chronic illness. Throughout the month you will face the daily stresses and challenges a person in poverty faces. A Poverty Simulation is not a game...it is an interactive experience that sensitizes participants to the realities of poverty.
