Immunizations for Students in Transition

Due to the chaos that can result from unexpected and frequent moves, parents and youth in homeless situations may have difficulty keeping track of their belongings; these may include documents ordinarily required for school enrollment, such as birth certificates, health records, and immunizations. State educational agencies (SEAs) must eliminate enrollment delays caused by requirements of immunization and other health records. Procedures should be established for referring parents, guardians, and unaccompanied youth to the local liaison for assistance in obtaining necessary immunizations, or immunization and health records.

To assist with needed immunizations:

- Establish a protocol for referring students to local low-cost health clinics
- Establish school-based immunization clinics or other opportunities for on-site immunizations
