7. Superintendent's Update:

- a. <u>Teacher of the Year</u>. Mrs. McKinney explained to the BOE members that the nomination for Teacher of the Year would be the recommendation of the PDC committee. The teacher may will also be nominated for Teacher of the Year for the State of Kansas.
- b. <u>Strategic Planning</u>. A brochure from Goddard schools was given to the BOE members as an example of a strategic plan. The BOE members would like to have time to think of ways to improve the current goals.
- c. <u>FMS Sports Numbers</u>. Handouts were included in the packet. Mr. Hewitt shared concerns from the coaches due to the numbers of participants being increased when sixth grade is included in the sports. Other items on the list were the FMS science labs, FACS room remodel and landscaping. Mr. Combs suggested seeking local bids for the remodel of the FACS room. Mrs. McKinney will pursue bids. It was suggested also to call Shon Yust for lighting ideas for the campus.

8. Capital Outlay Projects.

a. <u>Proposal for Updated Security Cameras.</u> Proposal from Jerry Butler, Jerry the Tech Guy, was included in the packet. The amount of the bid was \$10,594.00. Mr. Westfahl felt that the size of the hard drive may need to be increased.
