Tinker Time: Circuits/Backyard Birds

Targeted Age: All ages
Time/Date: Saturday, February 9, 2019 from 1 – 3 pm
Cost: None

Description: Combine your inquisitive mind with your creative abilities to make an illuminated Valentine’s Day card. You can do this by designing and building an electrical circuit using conductive tape, a watch battery and an LED. You will learn the parts of an electrical circuit and how a circuit works. You will also be able to build other circuits using a variety of materials.

After we tinker, we will search for birds!

Wintertime is an exciting time for bird-watching. During this time, some migratory birds join those already here to make South Arkansas their winter home.

Come to the museum to see how many different varieties of birds we can find.

Description: What was the fashionable style of hats in the 1920s? Learn the answer to this question as you make your own two-dimensional miniature hat in the style of the Roaring Twenties.

Spring Break: Cardboard Challenge

Description: Using cardboard and a variety of tools, participants will create houses, cars, toys, and other items from the 1920s era. You can let your creative skills loose, as you design and build.

Spring Break: Stop Motion Animation/3D Pens and a Silent Movie

Targeted Age: Kindergarten – 12th grade
Time/Date: Varies
Cost: \$45 a school year (includes t-shirt). Scholarships are available.

After-School Care

Targeted Age: Kindergarten – 6th Grade students
Time/Date: Monday-Friday from 3:15 – 5:30 pm
Cost: \$35/weekly or \$9/day for drop-in

Description: After-school care is provided for Kindergarten through sixth grade students who are enrolled on either campus in the school district. Students attending school at Norphlet are provided with bus transportation to Smackover Elementary School each afternoon. Students participating in after-school care receive a snack, homework help, and outside playtime when the weather permits. After-school care on early dismissal days is also provided for an additional \$5 fee. Pre-registration is required before a student can enroll in the after-school care program. Registration forms are available on the elementary school campuses.

Description: The Smackover Preschool Infant Room offers a safe, healthy, supportive and respectful learning environment designed to nurture young children and support their physical, intellectual, social and emotional development. The program meets all child care licensing requirements and has achieved the highest level ranking through the Better Beginnings Quality Rating Improvement System. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided to all students.

Description: The Smackover Preschool Toddler Room offers a safe, healthy, supportive and respectful learning environment designed to nurture young children and support their physical, intellectual, social and emotional development. The program meets all child care licensing requirements and has achieved the highest level ranking through the Better Beginnings Quality Rating Improvement System. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided to all students.

Smackover Preschool: ABC Program for 3 and 4 Year Olds

Targeted Age: 3 and 4 year olds
Time/Date: Monday-Friday from 7:45 am – 3:15 pm
Cost: No cost for qualifying students

Description: Smackover Preschool operates an Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) preschool program for three and four year old children through a grant awarded by the Arkansas Department of Human Services. The program meets all child care licensing requirements and has achieved the highest level ranking through the Better Beginnings Quality Rating Improvement System. Conscious Discipline is used to support the social, emotional development of students while Creative Curriculum is utilized to support the intellectual development of students. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided to all students.

Smackover Preschool: 3 and 4 Year Old Program (Tuition-Based)

Targeted Age: 3 and 4 year olds
Time/Date: Monday-Friday from 7:00 am – 5:30 pm
Cost: Current cost - \$85/weekly; 2019 – 2020 - \$95/weekly; 2020-2021 - \$105/weekly

Description: Smackover Preschool operates a preschool program for three and four year old children. The program meets all child care licensing requirements and has achieved the highest level ranking through the Better Beginnings Quality Rating Improvement System. Conscious Discipline is used to support the social, emotional development of students while Creative Curriculum is utilized to support the intellectual development of students. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided to all students.

Smackover Preschool: Before School Program

Time/Date: Monday-Friday from 7:00 – 7:45 am
Cost: \$10/weekly

Description: Smackover Preschool provides child care services from 7 am – 7:45 am daily for three and four year old students enrolled in the ABC program who need before school care.

Time/Date: Monday-Friday from 3:15 pm – 5:30 pm
Cost: Current cost - \$47.50/weekly; 2019-2020 - \$50/weekly

Description: Smackover Preschool provides child care services from 3:15 pm – 5:30 pm daily for three and four year old students enrolled in the ABC program who need after school care.
