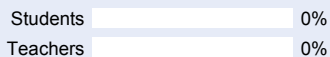

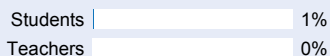

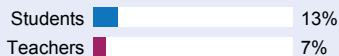

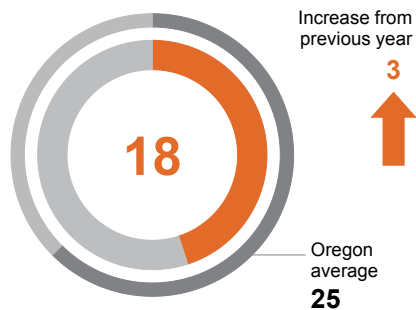

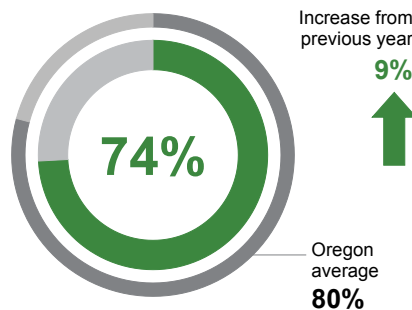
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

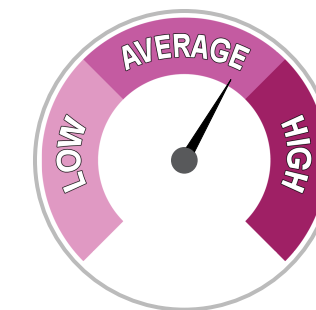
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

#### INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

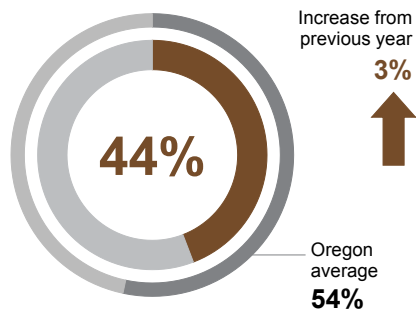
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

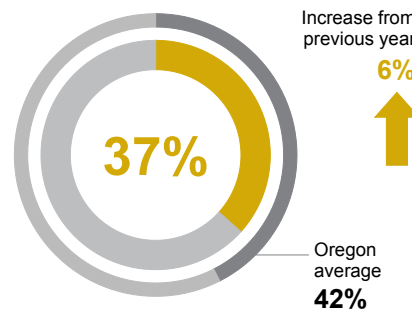
#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



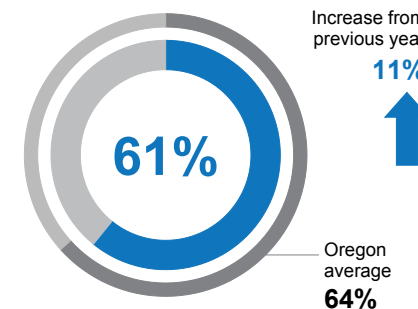
#### MATHEMATICS

### School Goals

Our most important goal is to increase regular student attendance. We are working to meet this goal in multiple ways. We are working to foster a welcoming environment for students, families and the greater community. We are also expanding our avenues of communication around attendance as well as academic progress. ### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

We are continually working to ensure our school is a place where students and families feel safe and welcome. Currently we have our Family Resource Center available to assist families in need as well as coordinate parenting classes, early childhood literacy workshops and programming to support new parents. #### BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

McKenzie strives to be a safe environment for students, families and staff.
