While I am not personally on Facebook for this very reason, it was discouraging and disheartening to hear reports from others with regard to what some parents and community members had to say. Unfortunately, they were way off base from the truth and only served to fuel the drama in what is already a tense and uncomfortable situation. I guess I always knew that social media had a dark side, but I was reminded even more over the last several days.
