Accessibility Section

<u>I.</u>

Fred C. Beyer High School provides opportunities for the participation of all parents, including parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory students.

Information and school reports are provided in a format and language that parents understand.

- The school works with teachers to keep PowerSchool up to date providing parents timely feedback.
- The school provides both written and visual aids for parents regarding how to use PowerSchool.
- The school mails home, and provides via email, quarterly and semester report cards.
 As well, the school provides Progress Reports to parents mid-way through each quarter.

Building Capacity for Involvement

Fred C. Beyer High School engages parents in meaningful interactions with the school. It supports a partnership among staff, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. To help reach these goals, the school has established the following practices:

- Opportunities to meet with the Beyer's academic counselors via meetings such as Coffee with the Counselors, Parent Information Nights, College Financial Aid Night.
- The school provides Back-to-School Night and Open House events each year
 where information is provided regarding curriculum, programs, and parents
 have the opportunity to meet the instructional staff to learn about the
 requirements and expectations of various courses.
- 2. The school provides parents with materials and training to help them work with their children to improve their children's achievement.
 - The District provides parent training providing ideas for keeping studentsengaged and motivated for academic achievement.
 - The school sends home progress reports and report cards to parents with students who are failing coursesas well as phone dialers informing parents that their student is in danger of failing a course and what to do to remedy that grade.

- 3. With the assistance of parents, the school educates staff members about the value of parent contributions and how to work with parents as equal partners.
 - Teachers are encouraged to include notes in PowerSchool
 - The site will incorporate into one of its Faculty Meetings a session on how faculty and parents/guardians can collaboratively work together for the benefit of the students.
 - The school encourages students to discuss classwork with parents and the teachers are encouraged to provide some form of credit if parents sign paperwork saying they discussed school work with the children.
- 4. The school coordinates and integrates the parental involvement program with other programs, and conducts other activities, to encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children.
 - The school provides Counselor & Parent Meetings to discuss Advanced Placement courses and requirements.

Involvement of Parents

To involve parents at Fred C. Beyer High School, the following practices have been established:

The school involves parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parental involvement policy.

Parent Involvement meetings are held each year to solicit input from parents about ways in which they can be active participants in their student's education.
