PAINTER

OVERALL RESPONSIBILITY

Under general supervision, perform skilled painting work on school District facilities.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Scrape, sand, fill, tape, mask, and prepare material surfaces for painting, including graffiti removal. E
- 2. Paint the interior and exterior of buildings, equipment, and structures. E
- 3. Apply by brush, roller, and spray equipment a variety of paint, varnishes, lacquer, floor and marine finishes. E
- 4. Finish furniture. E
- 5. Install, remove, replace, cut and glaze glass, glass mirrors, convex security mirrors and plastic. E
- 6. Repair, replace and install signs, window vinyl decals and window coverings. E
- 7. Set up and work from ladders and scaffolding. E
- 8. Install delineators and signage poles on concrete and asphalt surfaces. E
- 9. Prioritize work to address safety and environmental hazards. E
- 10. Work with site staff to minimize disruption of learning environment while completing duties or projects. E
- 11. Operate and work from motorized lift equipment. E
- 12. Operate and maintain various power tools and equipment (e.g. power sanders, scrapers, sand blasters, paint chippers, etc.). *E*
- 13. Operate line striping equipment. E
- 14. Lead the work of helper(s). *E*
- 15. Keep necessary records (e.g. time, labor, and materials required/expended per job). E
- 16. Attend Modesto City Schools' Asbestos Training Program within the first sixty (60) days of employment. E
- 17. Wear Modesto City Schools' identification during assigned work hours (e.g., badge or Modesto City Schools' shirt). *E*
- 18. Wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) (e.g. shoes, gloves, eye goggles, face protectors, aprons, and breathing apparatus, etc.), when necessary. *E*
- 19. Maintain a valid California Driver's License Class C. E
- 20. Maintain participation in CA DMV Assessment System/Automatic Pull Program. E

- 21. Utilize technology as appropriate to the position.
- 22. Effectively communicate and maintain cooperative relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- 23. Perform other related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge/Ability

Minimum Requirements:

Knowledge of equipment safety practices and procedures.

Knowledge/ability in the use and application of materials, tools, equipment, and methods used in painting.

Knowledge of and ability to perform data entry functions.

Knowledge of playground layout and design.

Ability to prepare rough sketches of work and estimates of time, labor and materials.

Ability to understand and implement oral directions and directions written in English.

Ability to perform basic arithmetic calculations with speed and accuracy.

Ability to set up and work from ladders and scaffolding.

Experience

Minimum Requirement:

Four (4) years experience as a painter or forty eight (48) months experience as a painter acquired through an accredited apprenticeship program, skill training program, or general experience.

Education

Minimum Requirement:

Graduation from high school or General Education Development (GED) Certificate or California High School Proficiency Examination (CHSPE) Certificate.

License/Certificate

Valid California Driver's License - Class C

Must provide a DMV printout within five (5) work days of offer of employment.

Physical Characteristics:

With or Without the Use of Aids:

Sufficient vision to read printed material and drive and operate equipment.

Sufficient depth perception. Sufficient color acuity.

Sufficient hearing to hear work area noise and normal conversation in person and on the telephone.

Ability to speak in a voice that can be clearly heard and understood on the telephone and in face-to-face conversations.

Ability to reach horizontally and vertically with arms. Sufficient dexterity to operate hand and power tools requiring strength and coordination, manipulate small objects, print or write legibly, operate precision tools, and make minute repairs.

QUALIFICATIONS (continued)

Physical Characteristics (continued):

Sufficient physical ability, strength, mobility, and stamina to drive a vehicle, climb ladders, bend, stretch, stand, kneel, walk, stoop, crawl, and extend legs.

Sufficient physical ability, strength, mobility, and stamina to perform heavy physical labor in hot, cold and inclement weather conditions.

Sufficient physical ability, strength, balance, and stamina to tolerate working on rooftops, scaffolds, and ladders at heights up to 50 feet, sometimes in precarious positions.

Sufficient physical ability, strength, mobility and stamina to lift, carry, push or pull objects which may frequently exceed 60 pounds in a series of functional tests which clearly simulates the work environment.

Physical tolerance to chemical odors, paint spray, and chemicals.

Pre-Employment Physical Examination

A physical and tuberculosis examination is required as a condition of employment. Examinations shall be administered by a District provider and be at the District's expense. Individuals must evidence ability to perform physical requirements of position and test negative for tuberculosis.
