## RESOLUTION NO. 16/17-23 Establishing Trustee Areas

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE MODESTO CITY SCHOOLS ESTABLISHING TRUSTEE AREAS AND METHOD OF ELECTION

WHEREAS, Article XV, Section 1500 of the Charter of the City of Modesto ("Charter") vests the control, management and administration of the Modesto City School District of Stanislaus County and the Modesto High School District of Stanislaus County, jointly referred to as "Modesto City Schools" or "the District" in the Modesto Board of Education ("the Board of Education"); and

WHEREAS, members of the Board of Education are currently elected at large from the territory within the District's boundaries, which includes the City of Modesto and other surrounding territory; and

WHEREAS, in June 2016, voters approved Measure F, an amendment to the Modesto City Charter Relating to the Elections of the Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Section 1500 of the Charter was amended to state, in pertinent part, "The Board of Education shall select a method of election for its members, by resolution, including but not limited to trustee or at large, in accordance with Chapter 1, Part 4, Division 1, Title 1 of the California Education Code, or any succeeding statute"; and

WHEREAS, Board Bylaw 9311 provides the Board of Education maintains the right to add new policies, including bylaws; and

WHEREAS, the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") was adopted by the California Legislature in 2002; and

WHEREAS, the change to district-based elections may be made in furtherance of the purposes of the CVRA; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education retained National Demographics Corporation ("NDC") to assist the District with a potential transition to district-based elections; and

WHERAS, on January 17, 2017 and February 6, 2017, the Board of Education held public hearings on the composition of trustee areas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education received four draft maps, identified as NDC 1, NDC 2, NDC 3 and NDC 4, for Board and public comment and consideration; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2017, the District made the draft maps available on the District's website; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2017, the District conducted community forums at Gregori High School and Johansen: High School; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2017, the Board of Education held the first public hearing on the draft maps of proposed trustee areas; and

WHERAS, on April 6, 2017, the District conducted community forums at Modesto High School and Beyer High School; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2017, the Board of Education held its second public hearing on the draft maps of the proposed trustee areas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has reviewed the draft maps and plans and, after consideration of all public input and analysis of proposed maps and now desires to adopt and establish trustee areas

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education hereby finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Board of Education exercises its authority pursuant to the Charter to select the method of election for its members by resolution;

<u>Section 2.</u> The Board of Education establishes trustee areas and each trustee area shall be represented by a Board member who resides in and is elected by voters residing within that trustee area. Trustee areas shall be balanced by population as required by state and federal law.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Board of Education adopts and establishes trustee areas reflected in NDC Map No. 3, and such map is incorporated herein.

<u>Section 4.</u> Prior to March 1 following the year in which the results of each decennial federal census are released, the Board of Education shall adjust the boundaries of the trustee areas based on population figures as validated by the Population Research Unit of the Department of Finance in accordance with Education Code 5019.5.

<u>Section 5.</u> This resolution shall be identified as "Board Bylaw 9220, Governing Board Elections" and shall be maintained in the Board's Bylaws.

<u>Section 6.</u> The District Superintendent and/or her designees are authorized pursuant to this resolution to take any action and/or execute any documents which are necessary to carry out, give effect to, and comply with the terms and intent of this resolution, including any further action required by the Stanislaus County Committee on District Organization, the City of Modesto, and the Stanislaus County Registrar.
