Winter Sports Update-

The Dance Team won their 7th consecutive Sectional Title and will compete in the IHSA State Dance Competition on Friday, January 25, with finals being held on Saturday, January 26.

Cheerleading enters competition at Sectionals on Saturday, January 26. The girls have earned 1st place at all 5 of their competitions this season.



Wrestling will compete in the MVC Conference Super Duals on Saturday, January 26, at Civic Memorial.

Boys Bowling had 5 members of the team qualify for Sectionals on January 21. Girls Bowling will be at Regionals on Saturday, February 2.

Boys and Girls Basketball are still competing in regular season play. Regional play will begin mid-February for the girls and late February for the boys.

Track and Field has begun their season and other spring sports will start at the end of February.

From Officer Chris Flake, SRO- Officer Flake visited with Mr. Elledge's Driver Ed. classes to discuss what to do if pulled over or involved in a traffic crash. Students had many questions on traffic laws. Officer Flake discussed the laws regarding the consumption of alcohol and driving under the influence. It was a great opportunity for students to learn how to handle situations they could encounter while driving and encourages good decisions behind the wheel.

From the School Counselors-Mary Jackson (Department Chair), Carrie Lieberman, and Amber Spaeth: In the month of December, 192 students signed in to see the school counselor individually. Of those students, 7.6% were freshmen,14.1% were sophomores, 25% were juniors, and 53.3% were seniors. Students who signed in stated they were visiting counselors for the following reasons: 51.1% for Academic concerns, 27.6% for College/Career concerns, and 21.3% for Personal concerns. In addition to seeing students who walked-in the office, counselors also completed Early Graduate exit interviews, the 2019-2020 Academic Planning Guide, balancing second semester schedules, attending a Career and Technical Counselor Workshop, SWIC Partnership Day, and SWISCA Counselor Academy on mindfulness. Counselors continued to prepare forms and information to meet with students to gather course requests for the 2019-2020 School Year. National School Counselor Week is February 4-8, 2019. <u>From Natalie Propst, School Nurse-</u> Just a friendly reminder that we are in the midst of flu season. Per the CDC, there are several steps you can take to protect your student and household from the flu, which include the following:

- Obtain the flu vaccination, which is recommended for those 6 months and older.
- 2. Stay away from those who are sick.
- Keep those who are sick with flu-like illnesses away from others, and keep those with illness home until fever free for 24 hours, without the use of medication.
- 4. Cover your mouth and nose with tissue when coughing or sneezing.
- 5. Wash hands often with soap and water, or alcohol based hand rub if soap and water are not available.
- 6. Avoid touching face (eyes, nose, and mouth).
- 7. Clean and disinfect surfaces that may be contaminated with germs with household disinfectants, according to label directions.


