

The EMT Program is a Basic Life Support level program designed to prepare the individual for the application skills in the field environment of an emergency ambulance. The program will cover all areas of Basic Life Support including airway care, oxygen therapy, patient assessment, trauma, medical emergencies, obstetrics, disaster management, and other topics. A minimum of 154 lecture and practical hours, plus 80 hospital/ambulance clinical hours is required. Successful students will be eligible to sit for the National Registry Practical and Written exams. A score of 50 is required on the ATI - TEAS test assessment for admission. Students who are currently enrolled in an EMT or EMT Paramedic class are eligible to enroll in the Emergency Operator 3: Ambulance (CEV03) for FREE.

MORE EMS COURSES

Courses conducted by the Emergency Medical Services programs not only prepare students to become EMT's and Paramedics, but also train members of local communities in a number of personal development and certification courses.

Registration for Short-Term Courses

Fall registration begins the first week of June for on-line customers each year. Students may register on-line, in person or by mail. Course fees are due at the time of registration. Please be sure to mark your calendar for the time and date your class begins. You are enrolled upon receipt of your class fees. You will not be notified unless your class is canceled. You are encouraged to register early, since classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Early registration also helps prevent the cancellation of a class due to insufficient enrollment. Most classes require a minimum of 10 students. You will be notified if the minimum is not met and the class must be canceled. Many of the classes have limited enrollment. Since we do not currently maintain waiting lists, enroll at your earliest convenience. You must be 18 years of age or older to register for classes.

Books and Supplies

Textbooks may be purchased at the Adult Education office, 1080 South Silver Springs Road, between 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Supply lists will be distributed at the time of registration for those courses requiring special materials.

Class Cancellation

A minimum number of students is required for each course offered. Courses with insufficient enrollment will be canceled and registrants will be notified by phone 2 days before the class start date or by email.

Smoking/Tobacco

The Career & Technology Center is a tobaccofree campus. Smoking or the use of tobacco in any manner is not allowed in any part of the building or on any school grounds.

Refund Policy: Short-Term Courses

For short-term programs (those not eligible for financial aid), if a student elects to drop a course, the student must noticy the CTC office. In addition, tuition adjustments may be considered on an individual basis depending on percentage of attendance.
