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# SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT TEAM

# SCHOOL-HOME CONNECTION

Parental support is critical when it comes to completing homework. These assignments support the work being done in the classroom daily by giving the student additional opportunities to practice the skills learned. With parental support and encouragement, students tend to put forth their best effort and perform better on assignments. You can help your child with homework by:

- Offering encouragement Give your child praise for effort and for completing assignments.
- Be available Encourage your child to do the work independently, but be available for assistance.
- Maintain a schedule Establish a set time to complete homework daily. Use a calendar to keep up with assignments and due dates.
- Designate space Set up a homework-friendly space stocked with supplies they may need for assignments (pencils, paper, crayons, etc.).
- Provide discipline Help your child focus on homework by removing distractions.
- Set a good example Consider doing some of your work during homework time (paying bills, reading, writing notes, etc.)
- Be supportive Talk to your child about difficulties with homework. Be willing to talk with your child's teacher to resolve problems in a positive manner.

- Make a plan Help your child break up projects or hefty assignments into manageable chunks.
- Let them complete their own work Children won't learn if they don't think for themselves and make their own mistakes. Parents can help explain directions or make suggestions, but let the child do the thinking.
- Stay involved Know your child's teacher and what they are looking for. Attend school events, ask about homework expectations, and how you can help your child be successful.
