

Weighted Grades at High School

- I. In order to meet the requirements of WV state Board Policy 2510, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, students taking Advanced Placement, Honors, Dual Credit, Project Lead the Way, and college courses would have their final average weighted in order to reflect the academic rigor of these classes.
- II. The following weight would be added to their yearly average for Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, Project Lead the Way, and college courses beginning with the 2022-2023 freshman cohort:

| <u>Average</u> | <u>Grade</u> | <u>Quality Points</u> |
|----------------|--------------|-----------------------|
| 90-100 | A | 5.0 |
| 80-89 | B | 4.0 |
| 70-79 | C | 3.0 |
| 60-69 | D | 2.0 |
| 0-59 | F | 0 |

- III. For Advanced Placement Courses, the weight would be added to the student's yearly average provided that the student took the test for the class.
- IV. The weighted average would be used as part of the consideration for graduation honors.
- V. The following weight would be added to their yearly average for Honors courses beginning with the 2022-2023 freshman cohort:

| <u>Average</u> | <u>Grade</u> | <u>Quality Points</u> |
|----------------|--------------|-----------------------|
| 90-100 | A | 4.5 |
| 80-89 | B | 3.5 |
| 70-79 | C | 2.5 |
| 60-69 | D | 1.5 |
| 0-59 | F | 0 |
