Superintendent Presler shared the following good news:

- Nobody was in the audience to recognize.
- Superintendent Presler shared some good news as did the administrators who were present.
 - Many staff have commented to me how pleased they were the Board invited them to participate in the search for a new superintendent. They felt the Board listened to their input.
 - Our CTE Welding students have an art sculpture displayed in downtown Clare in front of Isabella Bank. It's part of the Clare Arts Council's Sculpture Walk and will be displayed for a year.
 - Lindsey Murphy commented favorably on the Aspiring Leaders series! The series was designed by and facilitated by the local district Superintendents, including Superintendent Presler.
 - Katie Knapp-Wyman referenced the Family Fun Night that took place at the end of April! The Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) planned it, and the goal is to grow the event in upcoming years.
 - Beth Wood shared that the Area School Graduation was to take place on Friday afternoon with 3 graduates!
 - Rusty Govitz shared there was lots of community support on social media for the Turn-Around Student Awards and the CTE Excellence Awards!
 - Eric Johnson reported 45 CTE Digital Media and Welding students participated in the regional MITES (Michigan Industrial Technology Education Society) competition with 26 moving on to state competition and 4 bringing home First Place!
 - Ken Chinavare stated that M-STEP testing went very well this year from a technology standpoint!
 - Shay Anderson shared she will be President for the Michigan School Business Officials ISD Committee this coming year!
 - Mike Simon reported the RESD is fully staffed with Speech Language Pathologists after the two hires made by the Board!
 - Deb talked about the positive comments she heard from staff regarding the Superintendent interviews, and she shared a comment made by a local superintendent in another ISD who had worked within a bigger downstate ISD. He said he had dismissed CGRESA when he first drove by but has come to realize CGRESA is a "small but mighty" ISD and is impressed by all we're able to do!
- Superintendent Presler shared the following informational items.
 - There will be a memorial gathering for Lee and Mary (Magnus) Foster at the Magnus Center on Saturday, June 4. Signs have been designed for the Agriculture Learning Lab area in Lee and Mary's memory and the Wilhelm Joseph Magnus Building (Building B). The prototypes were shared with the Board and will be on display while we're waiting for the actual signs to arrive.
 - The sign by Mannsiding Road is rotting and needs to be replaced. Superintendent Presler asked for the Board's input on the style. Barb Richards recommended checking with Hoggers.

- Superintendent Presler reported Tara will be attending the summer MAISA conference with me in June.
- Superintendent Presler shared the Revenue Consensus was to take place on Friday.
- Superintendent Presler communicated some upcoming dates of interest to the Board, including Area School Graduation and the FFA Banquet.
