**POSITION:** Speech Therapist  
**JOB TYPE:** Part-time (3-5 days per week)  
**BARGAINING UNIT:** Non-Union  
**LOCATION:** Michigan School for the Deaf · Flint, Michigan

**This position is not a State of Michigan position; it is a Michigan School for the Deaf contracted position.**

## **JOB DESCRIPTION:**

The Michigan School for the Deaf is a day and residential facility for students who are deaf and hard of hearing. This position functions as Speech Therapist for the school portion of the Michigan School for the Deaf. The employee performs a full range of professional speech consultant assignments in a full functioning capacity. Considerable independent judgment is used to make decisions in carrying out assignments that have significant impact on services or programs. Guidelines may be available, but require adaption or interpretation to determine appropriate courses of action.

## **REQUIRED EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:**

**Education:** Possession of a Master's Degree in speech and hearing, speech pathology, audiology or audiometry.  
**Experience:** Certificate of Clinical Competence or a State of Equivalence in Speech Pathology from the American Speech-Language Hearing Association is required for all levels, professional affiliation with ASHA.

**ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:** Sign Language is preferred, but not required for hire. Must have a rating of Sign Language Proficiency Interview within two years of employment.

## **DUTIES:**

Oversees a variety of professional assignments to improve the speech functions of deaf students in a residential school setting.

- Evaluates and diagnoses speech disorders of students.
- Designs and implements therapeutic intervention strategies.
- Maintains student records and progress notes.
- Participates in IEPs addendums, REEDs, parent/teacher conferences.
- Performs wide range of screening and diagnostic tests.
- Prepares reports and prepares documents related to the work such as speech evaluations, IEP reports, develops individual goals and objectives.

Consults with and advises staff, as well as local agencies, in establishing and maintaining screening programs and related services for speech impaired children in accordance with Public Health Code, rules, and policies.

- Ensures the students with speech/language issues receive appropriate services including evaluation, treatment, plans and conducts therapy assessments and collects data.
- Consult with children, parents, teachers and other professional concerning speech, remediation and education of children with hearing and/or speech impairment.
- Consult with audiologist to coordinate proper training for students.
- Consult with the development and implementation of educational programming to meet specific needs of children with speech impairment.
