It has 10 public and private sender schools from communities within the townships of Avon, Grant, Lake Villa and Warren. Sending districts include Grayslake, Palombi, Millburn, and Woodland. Grayslake, a residential community is located 50 miles northwest of Chicago.

GNHS has an enrollment of 1239 students. The academic school year consists of two semesters. In 2021, D127 moved permanently to an A/B block schedule wherein students attend 4-90-minute classes per day, for eight total blocks across two days.

### **Advanced Placement Test Results**

In spring of 2022, a total of 371 students wrote 684 exams. Of the 371 students who took exams, 71% earned a score of 3 or higher. This is significant departure from the typical 80% as Covid decreased the number of students taking the exam as well as the passing rates. The following AP courses are offered:

- Students must successfully complete U.S. history, World History,
- Government/Civics, and pass tests on the Illinois and Federal Constitutions.
- Students must demonstrate college and career readiness on a state proficiency exam.
- A total of 23.0 Carnegie Units are required.
- Students must pass life fitness every semester in which they are enrolled except in the semester they are enrolled in health or when they are exempted by Board Policy.
- The graduation requirements for the Class of 2021 were reduced due to the Covid emergency to match the state-mandated minimum of 21, primarily impacting the number of required elective credits.
