Project Working Hours: Contractor to submit project schedule to school District for approval. Considerations given to not disrupt the learning environments during day's that school is in session.

Project Completion Date: September 1st, 2024. In the event of delay in project completion, the contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the school District, or agrees to a deduction from any funds due to the District, the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) per day for each and every calendar day thereafter, until such work shall be fully and finally completed in accordance with the contract, not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages arising from the loss of full use of the building(s), diversion of personnel time from other tasks, and other additional losses, inconveniences and damages of the District which are difficult to quantify. The parties agree that liquidated damages as described in this Agreement are a genuine estimate of District's foreseeable damages and are the District's sole remedy for such delay. Delays caused by Force Majeure events or by actions of District shall not constitute a delay resulting in the payment of liquidated damages.

BUILDING MECHANICAL BACKGROUND:

High School and Middle School Existing Equipment

Classroom Unit Ventilators

There is a total of **[64]** unit ventilators that serve classrooms. All these units are Dual Temperature hot water/chilled water units for heating and cooling. Three units also have split system condensing units to provide mechanical cooling when the central plant is heating mode or off. All unit ventilators are equipped with Dual Temperature (HW/CHW) coils, return air dampers, (where applicable DX cooling coils with associated condensing units) and outside air dampers which provide the required ventilation for the rooms.

Air Handling Units

There is a total of [3] air handling units serving the school. All units [2] Gymnasium, [1] Gymnasium Lobby are equipped with Dual Temperature coils for heating and cooling, return air dampers and outside air dampers. These [3] AHU's also have Condensing units located on the adjacent roof to provide mechanical cooling.

Rooftop Units (RTUs)

There are [14] Rooftop Units that serve the school. RTU-1 & RTU-2 are large VAV Packaged gas /electric units that are elevated on structural steel. RTU-3, RTU-5, & RTU-6 are constant volume gas/electric Rooftops that serve VVT zone systems. The remaining [9] RTU's are single zone constant volume units.

Makeup Air Units (MAUs)

There are [5] Makeup Air Units. These units utilize natural gas for heating, and split system DX condensing units for cooling.

Fan Coil Units

There is a total of [47] fan coil units throughout the school. These units provide heating/cooling and required ventilation for small offices, corridors, toilet rooms, entry ways, and vestibules. There units are both horizontal ceiling hung units, and vertical floor mount. All fan coils are connected to the dual temperature central plant.

Hot Water Boilers

- **Heating Boilers:** The existing hot water boilers (2) are 4500 MBH HB Smith Mills Boilers. They are vented using steel breeching which connects to a masonry chimney.
- Hydronic Pumps:
 - o [3] Hot Water/Chilled Water Pumps. 2-are duty, 1-is standby

Air Cooled Chiller

- Air Cooled Chiller: The existing air-cooled chiller is 1 nominal 300 chiller with dual circuited screw compressors.

Building Automation and Controls

The District's existing controls system was manufactured by Schneider Electric and was installed and currently being serviced by Combustion Service & Equipment Co. The system consists of controls located in the Middle/High School and the newer Elementary building. The software for the Middle/High School was upgraded to Schneider's Electric EcoStruxure when the newer Elementary building was built.

SCOPE OF WORK:

General Provisions/Information of Contractor's Work:

Definition: The word "Provide" means to furnish and install by contractor.

Contractor shall provide a turnkey labor installation, which includes the following services and their associated costs:

- 1) Provide HVAC Mechanical, Electrical and Structural engineering design by a licensed P.A. professional Engineer.
- 2) Provide compliance with all codes and standards IEC, IBC-2015, IMC-2015, IECC-2015, IFGC-2015, IEBC-2015, IPC-2015, ASHRAE, SMACNA, Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry.
- 3) Provide Engineered and Stamped Drawings and specifications suitable for Permit and Construction.
- 4) Recalculate heating and cooling loads in all spaces affected by this project to be used to properly select both the terminal and central equipment. Do not simply replace equipment one-for-one. Calculate the loads and apply results to properly size equipment in compliance with latest codes and standards.
- 5) Verify existing relief air route from all rooms within scope of work. Update relief air if required. Provide new relief openings with appropriate fire or fire/smoke dampers as required by IBC & IMC codes. (Cannot use corridors for return/relief air per 2015 IMC code.)

 - b. Provide replacement Unit Ventilators. New Units shall be Manufactured by Daikin. Units shall be equipped with ECM motors, Dual Temperature coils, RA, OA dampers. Units will come with DDC controls ready package to include OA/RA/SA sensors, freeze stat, OA/RA damper actuators all wired to a terminal strip.
 - c. New UV capacities per new heating/cooling calculations. Revise dual temperature coil capacities as required to meet calculated heating load.
 - d. Provide on demand ventilation controls to all unit ventilators and in all high occupancy areas per the IECC code. Provide means through control system to disable demand ventilation as needed to mitigate COVID 19 propagation using dilution ventilation.
 - e. Revise existing outside air percentage to reflect 2015 ASHRAE ventilation standards in all classrooms for all new unit ventilators.
 - f. Provide replacement of Condensing Units, Refrigerant Piping, and specialties to [3] Split System Unit Vents.

 - h. Provide interlocking of UV controls with associated exhaust fans where required.

2. Air Handling Units

- a. Provide refrigerant recovery per EPA regulations.
- b. Provide demolition and disposal of AHU-1, 2, & 3 and associated condensing units ACCU-1, 2, & 15.
- c. Provide new Daikin AHUs and condensing units. New units shall be sized for the newly calculated heat and ventilation loads. AHUs shall meet the latest high efficiency energy standards. Variable speed compressors and fans shall be used for balancing and single zone VAV operation. Energy recovery shall be included where required by energy code.

 - d. 3) Size 4" Metraflex Flex connector Pump Connector(s) S.S. Pump Connector(s), Pump Suction
 - e. 3) Size 4" x 4" Vaneflex Long Radius Pump Connector(s) S.S. Pump Connector(s), Pump Discharge
- I. Pumps shall be ECM/VFD variable speed "Smart "Pumps
- m. Provide All power wiring modifications required for a complete installation.
- n. Provide modification of existing boiler pads as required to accommodate new boilers.
- o. Provide all intake and vent piping per manufactures instructions. Determine vent/flue piping material based on manufacturer and code compliance.
- p. Provide Interlock new boilers to boiler room emergency shutdown switches and safety circuits.

7. Chiller Replacement.

- a. Provide refrigerant recovery per EPA regulations.
- b. Provide demolition and disposal for the existing chiller.
- c. Provide modifications to the concrete pad and fence enclosure as required to accommodate the new chiller.
- d. Final chiller sizing to be based on revised load calculations.
- e. Provide new air-cooled variable speed chiller as manufactured by Daikin. Chiller shall include Variable speed condenser fans on lead circuit, Microprocessor controller with Bacnet interface, Factory startup and first year labor warranty and an extended 2–5-year compressor parts warranty. Chiller shall also have single point power with unit disconnect.
- f. Provide all required power wiring. Any Modifications to the breaker size, conductor size or arrangement shall be included.
- g. Provide all required piping modifications to connect the new chiller to the Dual temperature piping system in the boiler room.
- h. Provide new Chilled water primary pumps (1-duty, 1-standby) and configure the chiller as a primary/secondary piping arrangement.
- i. Provide all Piping insulation and jacketing as required.
- j. Proved water balance

- 1. Building automation and Controls.
 - a. Provide labor, material, equipment, related services, and supervision required to furnish and install a complete building automation system for the mechanical equipment as listed in this RFP. The control system shall be a Schneider Electric EcoStruxure Building Automation System sold by Combustion Service and Equipment Co. (CS&E). The new control system will seamlessly integrate into the existing Schneider Electric EcoStruxure control system installed at the Elementary Building without any 3rd party interfaces or software.
 - b. The system will provide a graphical, web-based, operator interface that allows for instant access to any system through a standard browser. Control vendor must provide PC-based programming workstations, operator workstations and microcomputer controllers of modular design providing distributed processing capability and allowing future expansion of both input/output points and processing/control functions.
 - c. All DDC controllers must be BACnet IP, non-IP controllers are not acceptable.
 - d. The existing control system software at the Elementary Building shall be upgraded to EcoStruxure Rev 4.XX
 - e. Provide 24 Hours of owners training
 - f. One-year parts and labor warranty on all new controls and three years of software upgrades.

General Notes

- Contractor to include demolition and **disposal** of existing equipment to be replaced in dumpsters provide by the contractor.
- Provide all modifications to existing casework and receptacle locations to accommodate new equipment installations as required.
- Provide floor protection, and ceiling removal and reinstallation as required for all installations.
- Provide all electrical equipment, power wiring, conduit and installation as required to complete mechanical scope of work.
- Existing central heating equipment capacities will be evaluated and revised as required to accommodate new hot water plant system temperatures and to eliminate heating deficiencies.
- Recalculate/Revise water flow to terminal equipment as required. Provide new autoflow (pressure independent) valves and isolation valves on **ALL EXISTIUNG AND NEW** heating/cooling equipment.
- Evaluate existing dual temperature pipe sizes and provide re-sizing of piping to new/existing terminal equipment as required to accommodate new flow rates.
- Provide all roofing penetrations and roofing work for new equipment refrigerant/duct penetrations. Provide certified roofing contractor to perform work.
- Provide all new condensate piping and condensate termination points for equipment as required.
- Provide all insulation and tagging on equipment/piping/valving/ductwork per code.
- All installations shall comply with manufactures installation instructions.
- Provide [1] complete set of spare MERV 13 air filters for all new equipment.

- Contractor shall be responsible for the complete and proper new connection or reconnection of all new equipment with existing systems.

Special Project Conditions:

- A. The Subcontractor shall take the necessary precautions to ensure a safe and professional working environment. Subcontractor shall strictly adhere to Owner safety and work procedures, which include, but are not limited to:
 - A. Contractor shall comply with check-in/check-out procedures specified by Owner. These procedures shall include, but not be limited to signing in at the main office or facilities office promptly upon entering building. Contractor shall furnish and wear at all times an identification badge, displayed prominently on their person, and containing the following items: employee name, and employee company name.
 - B. Contractor shall provide applicable State of Pennsylvania Criminal Background Checks, FBI Criminal Background Checks, and Child Abuse and Neglect as required by Owner for all site personnel.
 - C. The use of building restrooms and parking arrangements for contractor's employees shall be arranged at each site, subject to Owner's approval.
- B. Alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, and weapons are prohibited on the Premises and will constitute grounds for immediate removal from the Premises. Contractor shall ensure that neither its' employees nor that of any sub-subcontractors engage in fraternization with Owner's employees at the Premises. Owner has the right to remove from the Premises any person whose presence is detrimental to the best interest of the Owner. Any person removed from the Premises may not return without the specific, written permission of the customer.
- C. During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to provide a drug-free workplace for its employees.
- D. Contractor shall confine Contractor's Work to areas permitted by the Contract Documents and any applicable laws, ordinances, permits and shall not unreasonably encumber the Premises with any materials or equipment, except to the extent required to safely and efficiently performs the Contractor's Work.
- E. Contractor shall incorporate conflict of interest clause in its subcontracts with each sub-contractor.
- F. Non-discrimination: Contractor hereby covenants and agrees as follows:
 - A. Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, or national origin, except where religion, sex or national origin is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of Contractor. Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - B. Contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Contractor, shall state that Contractor is an equal opportunity employer.

Before submitting bids, it shall be the responsibility of all bidders to attend one **MANDATORY Site Visit.** It is the responsibility of the contractor, by careful personal examination, to satisfy himself as to the nature and location of the work, the conformation of the ground, the character, quality, and quantity of the materials which will be required. By careful examination of the contract, the existing plans, the specifications, and all other documents and also data pertaining to the project and being in accord therewith, the contractor shall pre-determine the character of equipment and facilities needed, initially and during the prosecution of the work, the general and local conditions, and all other matters which in any way affect the work under this contract.

No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent, or employee of the School District, either before or after execution of this contract shall affect or modify any of the terms or obligations herein contained.

SUPERVISION OF WORK

The contractor shall supervise and direct the work, using his best skill and attention. He shall be solely responsible for all construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures and for coordinating all portions of the work under the contract.

Unless otherwise specifically noted, the contractor shall provide and pay for all labor, materials, equipment, tools, construction equipment and machinery, water, heat, utilities, transportation, and other facilities and services necessary for the proper execution and completion of the work.

The contractor shall at all times, enforce strict discipline and good order among his employees and shall not employ on the work any unfit person or anyone not skilled in the task assigned to him.

The contractor shall employ only such foremen, superintendents, and workmen as are careful and competent and the School District may demand the removal of any person employed by the Contractor who shall be guilty of misconduct, or who neglects or refuses to comply with the directions given and such person shall not again be employed at the site of this contract without express written consent of the School District. Failure of the contractor to comply with these provisions shall be sufficient reason for the District to withhold all payments which are or may become due, or the Secretary or his representative may suspend the work until compliance with such orders is affected.

It will be the contractor's responsibility to protect all surrounding areas and items from damage. All clean-up required after work is completed will be done by the contractor. All debris will be completely removed from the job site. All areas will be left in a Broom Clean condition as found prior to starting work.

Permits may be required for construction, alterations, or additions. It will be the Contractors responsibility to check with local authorities as to the need for permits; provide all information,

drawings, etc., required for such permits; secure and pay for such permits. The Contractor will also make arrangements for any inspections that may be required to secure final approvals and certificates as required. All Federal, State, and Local regulations, provisions or requirements must be met by the Contractor. Special attention will be given to the handling of hazardous materials and the disposal of hazardous waste as dictated by law.

BID GUARANTY

All bids shall be accompanied by certified check or surety bid bond, in the amount of not less than ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bid.

The School District shall, as soon as practicable, award the contract to the lowest responsible qualified bidder who shall deliver to the District before final execution of contract can be effected, a certified check or specific performance bond having as surety a surety company authorized to transact business in this Commonwealth, or two individual sureties approved by the Solicitor of the District, in the amount of 100% of the contract amount, as surety against defective or inferior materials or workmanship which may develop during the period of one (1) year from the date of total completion and acceptance of all work performed under the contract.

The awarded bidder shall also furnish a payment bond for labor and materials in the amount of 100% of the contract amount. This bond is to assure prompt payment by the contractor to his suppliers for labor and/or materials furnished to the contractor to complete the work.

The award is conditional on the contractors furnishing the above two (2) bonds which must be submitted to the District within 21 days from date of notification. The bonds will be retained until the project is completed and will not be returned.

COMPETENT WORKMEN

No workmen shall be regarded as competent first class, within the meaning of this Act, except those who are duly skilled in their respective branches of labor, and who shall be paid not less than such rates of wages and for such hours work as shall be established and current rates of wages paid for such hours by employers of organized labor in doing of similar work in the District where work is being done. (Section 752 of the Public-School Code of 1949, as amended).

HUMAN RELATIONS ACT

The provisions of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act, Act 222 of October 27, 1955 {P.L. 744) (43 P.S. Section 951, et. Seg.) of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania prohibit discrimination because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age, sex, national origin, handicap, or disability, by employers, employment agencies, labor organizations, contractors, and others. The contractor shall agree to comply with the provisions of this Act as amended that is made part of this specification. Your attention is directed to the language of the Commonwealth's Non-Discrimination Clause in 16 PA Code 49.101.
