### **Athletics**

- The majority of the 2022-2023 athletic budget is allocated for coach salaries, the cost of officials as per the state/conference recommendation, yearly dues, rental fees, and entry fees for the numerous athletic programs within the district. In addition, middle school athletics will continue to be assessed a fee for each sport.
- Funds are allocated for the following:
  - Equipment maintenance
  - Equipment repair
  - Replacement of equipment
- A safety allowance is designated for the maintenance and repair of items such as:
  - Reconditioning and replacement of helmets/equipment
  - Safety Check and repair of Gymnastic Equipment
  - Sanitation of Wrestling Mats and Equipment
  - Concussion Testing
  - Swim Coaches Certifications

### **Athletics**

- South Plainfield Athletic Budget supports 61 athletic programs throughout the district including varsity, sub varsity, and middle school. The budget includes coaches stipends, equipment (purchase, repair) officials and security.
- The district has a total of 1,166 students participating in athletic programs in both the middle school and high school. The total rises above 75% when including multi-sport athletes.
- Money is budgeted on an annual basis for basic needs such as:

- Replacement Uniforms
- Baseball Caps –recurring cost
- Game Balls- recurring cost

- Hurdles- replacement

# Technology Upgrades

- Additional Security Cameras Expansion of the security camera system to cover the Roosevelt Administration building in preparation for Preschool.
- One to One Lifecycle Replacement The first round of student devices will be replaced this year. Devices for the entire student population are now on a 4 year lifecycle.
- **Staff Device Replacements** District faculty and staff are also up on the 4 year device replacement plan. Devices for faculty and staff will be upgraded in the fall of 2022.

- **Website and District App** A new website will be launched with a fully functional app to allow for greater communication with the community through the use of social media and phone based apps.
- Complete Replacement of Building PA Systems A portion of our district PA systems were migrated to IP based PA systems which can integrate directly with our existing phone systems as well as our emergency notification system. In this final phase, we will complete this project.

# 2022/2023 Budget Highlights


- Total operating budget: \$73,324,094
- 2% General Fund Tax Levy increase: \$1,037,344
  - FY22 General Fund tax levy = \$52,904,547
- Health benefit cost increase of 10.50%, as recommended by the insurance broker
- \$2,500,000 budgeted withdrawal from capital reserve
  - Used for renovation of the High School Auditorium and Life Skills classroom, district wide paving and fencing upgrades and Elementary Schools spacing upgrades
- \$1,000,000 budgeted withdrawal from maintenance reserve:
  - Used for replacement of LED lights district wide, ongoing painting district wide, flooring and asbestos abatement district wide, elementary kitchen upgrades, and field upkeep


- State Aid allocation:

## Tax Levy

- 2022 to 2023 Tax Increase Difference
  - Total \$307,382 levy increase
  - 2021 average tax increase \$45
  - 2022 average tax increase \$16
- Numbers are based off average assessed home value of \$123,828
- Includes tax relief of \$300,000. This is year 2 of the districts 4 year tax relief plan
