- The reindeer were only introduced in "Twas the Night Before Christmas" (originally 'A Visit from Saint Nicholas' was a poem written in 1822).
- . It was the first work that detailed the man himself, among those details, he was said to ride a sleigh led by reindeer!



FACT #3: Coca-Cola created the modern Mr. Claus

- . In the late 1800s, Santa Claus was traditionally depicted wearing red (Louis Prang, an artist, created Christmas cards in 1885 depicting Santa in that way).
- · However, artist Haddon Sundblom illustrated Santa's red suit for a widelycirculated campaign for Coca-Cola.



FACT #4: Mall Santa is a 120-year-old tradition

- In 1890, James Edgar was the first department store Santa, it was initially just a marketing ploy but was very popular
- . Children from all over the state dragged their parents to Edgar's store and a tradition was born



FACT #5: Santa was once a bachelor

- Mrs. Claus was mentioned in an 1849 short story, "A Christmas Legend" by James Rees.
- Then Mrs. Claus was mentioned in several literary publications, like the Yale Literary Magazine and Harper's Magazine.
- Mrs. Claus became famous after being mentioned in Katherine Lee Bates' 1889 poem, "Goody Santa Claus on a Sleigh Ride"
