



What is Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting is a flexible, year-round program that focuses on teaching youth in grades 5K-5th to be the best version of themselves! The aims of Scouting are to develop character, citizenship, personal fitness, and leadership.

How does the program work?



Small Groups

Scouts work together in a group of six to eight children in the same grade. They develop new skills and interests, practice sportsmanship and good citizenship, and learn to do their best. Youth are recognized through an advancement plan that provides fun for the Scout, while teaching the importance of setting and reaching goals.



Flexibilty

Families have the ability to choose Cub Scouts for their sons AND daughters. Families today are busier than ever and with less free time, and convenience. Most Scout groups hold weekly one-hour meetings and one weekend activity per month. Any missed meetings can be made up at home with a Scout's family.



Family Involvement
