Our program uses the Parents as Teachers curriculum, a nationally recognized and evidence-based program shown to improve school readiness. We customize our schedule to meet your needs. Our program includes the following:

- Age appropriate activities at each home visit
- Interactive books and games for you to enjoy with your child
- Model activities you can do at home with your child

- Resources on your child's monthly development in all areas (physical, socialemotional, language, and cognitive development)
- Basic screenings are conducted throughout the program to give you information about your child's development
- Resources on other topics, such as nutrition, local activities, local resources, etc.
- We leave a new book with your child at each visit!



Q: Does participating in this program mean I'm not already doing a great job as a parent?

A: Of course not! This program is meant to support parents by providing additional materials and modeling specific activities to continue to promote growth. You don't have to be bad to get better!

Q: How often are home visits, and how long do they last?

A: Our program is customized to match your schedule. We typically meet everyother week or monthly. Visits usually last between 45 minutes to one hour, based on your schedule. We schedule visits with you, and never come for an unscheduled visit.

Q: What happens during a home visit?

A: Your teacher will share information with you about your child's development based on their age, and will bring age appropriate books, games, and activities to use to interact with your child. Your teacher will also share any other resources you ask about or are interested in, and answer any questions you might have.

Q: What do the parents do during a home visit?

A: Parents participate in all of the stories, games, and activities right along with the teachers.
