

Asking The Right Questions in the Math Classroom: The Usefulness and Benefits of Assignments and Homework (Grades 6-12)

Content in this one-day workshop will focus on the teacher being a “facilitator of learning”, not just the “conveyor of knowledge” or “sage on the stage”. The presenter will share ways to assign fewer math problems for practice and how to gain greater mathematical understanding from completed work.

Teachers will learn to formulate questions for a variety of lessons that ask students to think and discuss deeper, rather than just finishing off an assignment of 20-30 similar math problems.

The presenter will model new techniques for getting students to both verbalize and to discuss in detail what they are doing mathematically.
