- Create a safe and welcoming school community for everyone — students, parents and all staff
- Adopt universal school rules:
- Regularly teach and practice the school-wide expectations
- Notice and acknowledge students who demonstrate positive behaviors
- Proactively supervise all common areas
- Identify and proactively address behavior concerns: school-wide, group, and individual.
- Understand and utilize a variety of consequences which are routinely evaluated for effectiveness.

How Can Parents Use PBIS at Home?

Use the school rules at home:

- Be respectful
- Be in-control/safe
- Be responsible

Set clear expectations:

- Take time to explain your expectations — explain what the behavior looks like.
- Practice how to do what you have asked.
- Make sure your child understands the directions. Ask them to repeat the directions in their own words.
- Observe and discuss the results.

Make sure consequences are:

- Clearly stated without emotion
- Realistic and enforceable
- Predictable and consistent
- Age appropriate

Acknowledge your child when they do the right thing:

- Use verbal praise
- Go to the park
- Spend one-on-one time
- Play a game with your child
