Smithville's District-wide Homecoming festivities run September 27-October 1. This year's theme is "ROAD TRIP".



ARCHERY PROGRAM AWARDED GRANT

The Smithville High School and Middle School Archery teams were awarded over \$26,000 in equipment through a grant from the NRA Foundation. Head Archery Coach Jeremy Batliner stated, "The archery program has been a way to get kids involved that you wouldn't normally see in any other sport, as you don't have to be the strongest or the fastest. With the equipment & funds we received from the NRA Foundation Grant we will now be able to add NASP IBO 3D (3D animal targets) to our competitions for our archery teams, along with being able to help the PE classes at the High School and Middle School have more kids engaged at one time during classes." The archery program at Smithville School District began in the 2016-2017 school year and has been expanding over the last 5 years. Currently there are 24 archers on the Middle School team and 17 on the High School team. The National Archery in the Schools Program is an in-school program aimed at improving educational performance among students in grades 4–12. Through it students are learning focus, self-control, discipline, patience, and life lessons required to be successful in the classroom and in life. Batliner said, "Currently our District offers this program in grades 7-12, but hope to see it in our elementary buildings for grades 4-6 soon "
