## **Course Description**

This course is an advanced application of graphic communications with emphasis on print, web, and social media content creation. Students will practice and refine their graphic design production skills by pre-production planning, workflow organization, design, layout, basic photographic camera operation, revision, production, and distribution. Students will learn basic job skills in addition to the appropriate state standards for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders. This course will consist of 60%\*(or more) of hands-on lab time. Please plan accordingly.

\*This course is part of a dual enrollment program with Northland Pioneer College (NPC). Students will have the opportunity to receive college credit and certificates of completion for portions of this course. Part of the class will be treated as a college level class and students will be expected to treat it as such. ## **Course Objectives**

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to plan projects, design products, and manage production runs as well as identify the steps and processes used during a project. Students will also be able to create and manipulate digital images and artwork as well as create work to customer specifications. The student will become proficient in the Adobe suite of applications (Adobe Creative Cloud) and participate in many work-based learning experiences.

# **Standards Based Grading:**

SLHS is transitioning to a Standards Based Grading (SBG) system. This simply means that all assignments that will be computed into a student's grade will be based on their mastery of the standard and not directly reflect behavior or other factors in the classroom. There may be some tasks that appear in the gradebook that are considered practice: these may not be calculated into the actual grade, but they should be considered as an indication for how the student is doing.

- Students may redo an assignment if they wish to try again to demonstrate mastery of the standard.
- Students that are failing, may be required to attend reteach on Fridays until they master the standard.
- If a student receives an Incomplete on a standard, they will automatically fail the class if it is not corrected by the end of the semester. Students need to demonstrate that they have at least attempted to show mastery of the standard in order to receive credit in the class.
- Students may be required to complete additional practice before receiving the opportunity to redo an assignment. They can't just fail a test and retake it as many times as they wish. Students must show that they are attempting to relearn the material before attempting.
