SAFE AND ORDERLY ENVIRONMENT

- **Child Abuse Reporting Policy (Site Specific):** ALL Hesperia Junior High School employees will follow all Hesperia Unified School District Board policy for reporting suspected child abuse. ALL Hesperia Junior High School employees are mandated reporters.
 - If child abuse suspected or reported the employee will take the mandatory step of submitting a suspected child abuse or neglect report to the County of San Bernardino Children and family Services.
 - **What are the criteria for reporting suspected child abuse/neglect?**
The report pertains to a child under the age of 18 years.
The report alleges abuse, neglect or imminent risk of harm to the child.
The alleged perpetrator is:
 - a parent or caretaker
 - a relative or other person living in the home
 - an educator, volunteer, or employee of a recreational/organizational setting who is responsible for the child; or any individual providing treatment, care or supervision for the child.
 - **What information should be reported?**
 - The nature of specific incident(s) you are reporting and
 - Date(s) and descriptions(s) of the injuries or dangers
 - Identities of perpetrator(s) and their relationship/s to the child
 - Witnesses to the incident(s) and how they may be reached
 - Details of any physical evidence available
 - The perpetrator's current access to the child
 - Present condition/status of the child (for example: in need of medical attention)
 - The location of the child
 - Statements from the child(ren) when possible
 - **What happens when I report child abuse?**
Children and Family Services (CFS) social work staff determines how to proceed with an investigation by assessing the referral information and focusing on present and potential future risk to the child. An assessment tool assists the social worker to determine how to respond and what priority to assign that referral.
- **Campus Visitors/Volunteers**

- All visitors to Hesperia Junior High School will check in at reception located in the Main Office. Visitors will wear Hesperia Junior High School Visitor Passes. All volunteers will be board approved and appropriate background checks will be completed.
- **Pick-Up and Drop Off**
 - Student vehicle drop off is located at the back field gate located on 11th Street, nearest to cross street of Willow.
 - Main entry for all visitors and visitor parking is located off of Cypress Avenue. A student “walker” gate is located next to the main entry gate off of Cypress Avenue.
 - Hesperia Junior High’s Bus Circle is located off of Willow between 11th Street and Cypress Avenue.
 - Two bike racks are located on campus for students who ride bicycles to school.
 - Campus Assistants are located at every entry and exit point both before and after school during student entry and exit.

Accomplishments/Areas of Pride

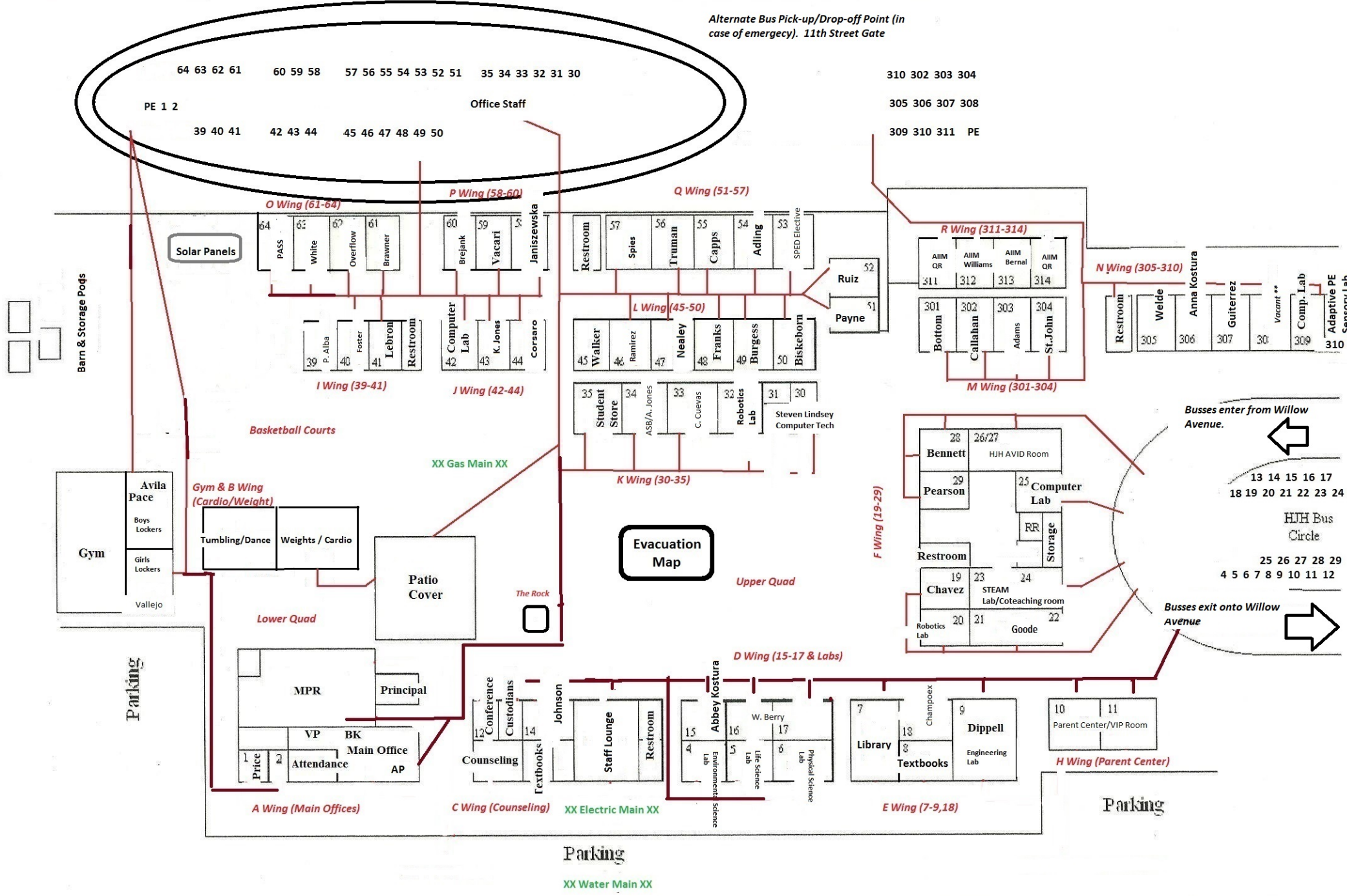
1. Decrease in Student Discipline, especially 48900a1 suspensions

5. Successful evacuation drills, including fire and earthquake. Each drill has produced reduced evacuation times.
6. Successful Code Red Drills, including one held during nutrition.

Summary of Areas of Desired Change

Findings & Desired Improvements

1. Continue to decrease successful evacuation time during drills.
2. Better utilization of Code Red Drill notification system (CISCO phones).
3. Continue to decrease student conflicts through use of positive prior mediation.

Buses enter from Willow Avenue.

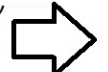
