

# SPECIALTY MODULES

Specialty Modules are half-credit courses offered to students at Bellows Free Academy. All of these programs feature engaging environments and rigorous curriculum. These courses serve as an opportunity for students to sample the Northwest Technical Center before committing to a full-year program. Specialty Modules offer insight to the career paths and standard practices of professionals in their respective fields. These elective courses fit well in the schedules of freshman and sophomore students.

## **70725 Power Sports Equipment & Tech**

A hands on introduction to the maintenance and repair of four-stroke engines and a variety of power sports equipment. Skills for entry-level employment in dealerships and independent repair facilities are taught.

## **70805H All About Hair**

Students will be introduced to skills such as hair care, hair manipulations, communication and business skills. These skills will be learned through demonstrations on mannequins and by working with fellow students.

## **70776 Baker's Apprentice**

Students coming into this program will be exposed to various techniques and products associated with the pastry kitchen. Students will cover paste, dough, lamination, cakes, and many other confections.

## **70801 Digital Imaging**

This course introduces fundamental principles of digital photography, and will teach students how to manipulate their images using Adobe Photoshop.

## **70804 Computers & Networking**

Students learn client server operating systems, networking protocols, workstation management, and constructing computers and hardware maintenance.

## **70807 Teacher Prep**

Learn the basics of learning theory including learning styles, how you learn, how learning changes as we develop over time, special learning needs, and what it takes to become a teacher.

## **70812 Construction Trades Foundations**

Students will be exposed to power tools and safety practices related to construction and will be able to identify the various employment opportunities in the construction field.

## **70805 Spa Magic**

Learn the basics in performing spa services and discover the importance of professional image. Learn how to do facials, hand and foot massage, manicures, pedicures, and make-up.

## **70811 Culinary Classics**

Cooking methods, knife skills, and basic fabrications are some of the skills covered in this class. Students will learn about the five tastes and how their relationship affects the composition of a dish.

## **70819 Digital Video Basics**

Students will learn the basics of digital video editing in this course. They will spend the semester learning to create short videos for distribution on the web.

## **70810 Perspectives in Human Services**

Students will explore concepts in Human Services through the use of popular youth literature. Topics include ethics, family and professional dilemmas, mental health, family crisis centers, and more.

## **70806 Rescue 911**

Students learn the most practiced skills and drills used in today's emergency situations. Course will include CPR & First Aid Certification through the American Red Cross.
