


2022 Reading Language Arts Summer Reading Project

Current Event	Movie Pitch	Sequel
<p>Connect the book to a current event or social issue. Using textual evidence and analytical skills, determine how the book is similar or different from the current event or social issue. Create a poster board representation or digital representation of your connections. Click here for rubric.</p> 	<p>Write a convincing business letter to a movie production company urging it to transform the book into a film. Give suggestions as far as film title, casting, locations, plot changes, soundtrack music, etc. Persuade the producers why widespread audiences would pay money to see this film. Click here for rubric.</p> 	<p>Write the first chapter in the sequel to the book. What characters will you include? What will be the major conflict or tension? Where and when will the sequel or chapter take place? Be sure to use a similar language and writing style to the original novel. Click here for rubric.</p>

<p>Create a One Pager over the book. A One Pager is a single-page response that shows your understanding of a piece of text you have read. A book trailer basically summarizes the book in the form of a movie trailer, making others want to read the book. Click this link for an example of a Book Trailer.
