  - Terrorism-related crime
  - Signs of terrorism
  - How to report suspicious activity



# Recognize Suspicious Activity

- Suspicious activity – observed behavior
  - Indicates pre-operational planning
  - Associated with terrorism or terrorism-related crime
- Some activities could be innocent
- Only trained law enforcement official
  - Determine when the behavior warrant additional action

# Remember

These factors are not suspicious behavior:

- Race
- Ethnicity
- Gender
- National origin
- Religion
- Sexual orientation
- Gender identity

# Nine Signs of Suspicious Activity

1. Expressed or Implied Threat
2. Surveillance
3. Theft/Loss/Diversion
4. Testing or Probing of Security

# Nine Signs of Suspicious Activity

5. Breach/Attempted Intrusion
6. Eliciting Information
7. Misrepresentation
8. Cyberattack
9. Sabotage/Tampering/Vandalism

# How to Report Suspicious Activity

- The 5 W's
  - Who
  - What
  - When
  - Where
  - Why
- Emergency – Call 911
- Notify local law enforcement
- In Dallas County, call 844-643-2251
