**Community and School**

Western Harnett High School serves a primarily rural community with some clusters of suburban development. The community is readily accessible to Fayetteville and Sanford in surrounding counties with close proximity to two military bases (Ft. Bragg and Pope AFB). Western Harnett High School is a public school serving approximately 1400 students in grades 9-12. Students attend school in a concentrated curriculum or ‘block’ schedule consisting of four courses in 90-minute blocks each semester.
