From the School Counselors-Mary Jackson (Department Chair), Carrie

Lieberman, and Amber Spaeth- In the month of January, 505 students signed in to see the school counselor individually. Of those students, 42.8% were freshmen, 36.3% were sophomores, 8.8% were juniors, and 12.2% were seniors.



Students who signed in stated they were visiting counselors for the following reasons: 83% for Academic concerns, 8.1% for College/Career concerns, and 2.1% for Personal concerns. The counselors met individually with all freshman and sophomores on their caseloads to discuss academic planning and preparations for the 2019-2020 school year. With the help of faculty and ambassadors, 8th grade parent night was hosted on January 30th. We had an amazing turnout. In addition, the school counselors completed schedule changes the first two days of the semester and met with new students in the district. The counselors continued to prepare forms and information to meet with HMS and St. Paul students by gathering course requests for the 2019-2020 School Year. From Mr. Caleb Houchins, Associate Principal-

On January 24, Highland High School hosted drug and alcohol counselor Ty Bechel, a recovering addict, to tell his story of addiction, hope, and recovery. Ty shared his troubled story of drinking and smoking marijuana during high school, and eventually moving on to much stronger, more addictive drugs that turned into a monster. Ty's entire life was eventually consumed by trying to find and use heroin and other opioids he could get his hands on. Students heard firsthand details about Ty's difficult journey as he was arrested and released from jail several times. Eventually, Ty was able to find a successful program that helped to get him clean through the assistance of the Madison County Drug Courts. Today, Ty is the President and Founder of *Amare*, a Non-Profit Group that helps with addiction and recovery. He is also a Program Coordinator for Chestnut Health Systems in Granite City, IL.

This presentation was very beneficial for students as they heard first hand accounts of how easy it is to become addicted to drugs and alcohol. Ty is a fantastic storyteller who was able to hold the students' attention and deliver a strong message to avoid drugs and alcohol.



We are hopeful this message discourages students from trying drugs and alcohol, and we are also encouraging any student who is dealing with addiction to reach out and get help. 




